What is this thing called love?

- ✓ Love is a feeling of affection that results in self-sacrificing service of the one loved.
- Love is a commitment to move toward others with a sincere interest in understanding the deepest longings of their soul and a willingness to help them realize those longings.
- ✓ Love is Listening to concerns, Overlooking faults, Valuing strengths, and Empathizing with the pain of others.

I If I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, but do not have love, I have become a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. 2 And if I have {the gift of} prophecy, and know all mysteries and all knowledge; and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. 3 And if I give all my possessions to feed {the poor,} and if I deliver my body to be burned, but do not have love, it profits me nothing."

√ The power of AGAPE.

Lessons from this text

- ✓ Powerful ministry gifts can function without AGAPE. Just because a person is gifted does not mean they are Godly.
- AGAPE is more than action, it is an attitude. Just because a person gives sacrificially does not mean they are gracious.
- AGAPE is what makes everything in the Kingdom significant and powerful. Just because a person is accomplished does not mean they are significant in God's eyes.

I Corinthians 13:1-13

"4 Love is patient, love is kind, {and} is not jealous; love does not brag {and} is not arrogant, 5 does not act unbecomingly; it does not seek its own, is not provoked, does not take into account a wrong {suffered,} 6 does not rejoice in unrighteousness, but rejoices with the truth; 7 bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things."

Note what is NOT said!

- ✓ There is no mention of feelings or emotion. Is agape distinct from a "feeling?"
- ✓ There is no mention of sacrificial service or meeting the needs of others. Why?
- √ There is no mention of action per say. I thought "love" was a verb!
- √ There is no mention of social justice or peace making. Does this not count?

Lessons from this text

- ✓ AGAPE is seen in the way it forgets about self in its concern for others. Don't try to justify self-protective defensiveness with love.
- AGAPE is seen in the way it responds to personal injustice. Look at personal injustice as a call to show love.
- ✓ AGAPE is seen in the way it sees the big picture. Don't let the immediate circumstances blind you to the big picture.

I Corinthians 13:1-13

"8 Love never fails; but if {there are gifts of} prophecy, they will be done away; if {there are} tongues, they will cease; if {there is} knowledge, it will be done away. 9 For we know in part, and we prophesy in part; 10 but when the perfect comes, the partial will be done away. 11 When I was a child, I used to speak as a child, think as a child, reason as a child; when I became a man, I did away with childish things."

√ The permanence of AGAPE.

Lessons from this text

- Charismatic gifts and ministries are temporary. Keep the main thing the main thing.
- ✓ The gifts are not infallible. Cultivate a humble and teachable spirit.
- ✓ The mark of spiritual adulthood is AGAPE. Strive to grow in love not just in the competent use of gifts.

I Corinthians 13:1-13

"12 For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face; now I know in part, but then I shall know fully just as I also have been fully known. 13 But now abide faith, hope, love, these three; but the greatest of these is love."

√ The priority of AGAPE.

Lessons from this text

- ✓ No one sees clearly in this age. Listen to and learn from others.
- ✓ No one knows fully in this age. Humility is in order.
- √ Faith, hope, and AGAPE are fundamental to Kingdom living in this age.

What is AGAPE love?

AGAPE is a God given, tenacious, insightful, response of radical grace

to the insults and injustices of life.

I Peter 3:8-9

"8 To sum up, let all be harmonious, sympathetic, brotherly, kindhearted, and humble in spirit; 9 not returning evil for evil, or insult for insult, but giving a blessing instead; for you were called for the very purpose that you might inherit a blessing."
