

To avoid fear - first:


Don't place your hope and faith in any one form of human government.

God's Kingdom is not of this world. (separation of church & state)




Why does this matter as citizens of the U.S.A.?


1. It shapes our expectations for our nation.

1. Today's Christian nationalists have a good portion of early American history on their side.

Puritan Christian Nationalism

The Puritan's believed:

- 1. Old Testament Israel is our story.
 (The O.T. is to be applied directly to our situation.)
- 2. Political freedom is a part of the Gospel. (There was a need to justify a break from England.)
- 3. Providence is assurance of God's favor. (The success of the American Revolution is a sign of God's sovereign hand on America.)

"The majority of the earliest settlers were Puritans from England. Unlike their cousins back home, these American Puritans strongly identified with both the historical traditions and customs of the ancient Hebrews of the Old Testament. They viewed their emigration from England as a virtual re-enactment of the Jewish exodus from Egypt: England was Egypt, the English king was Pharaoh, the Atlantic Ocean their Red Sea, America was the Land of Israel, and the Indians were the ancient Canaanites. They were the new Israelites, entering into a new covenant with God in a new Promised Land."




Without a Biblical / Ethic:


- Democracy becomes the abuse of the minority by the majority.
- Capitalism becomes the exploitation of the powerless by the powerful.
- Morality is reduced to an endless litigation of superficial rules and rights.
- Virtue is defined by personal preference, taste, and power.

6. Three Secular Reasons why America should be Recognized as "Under God".

- 1. Your rights cannot be taken away by the government if they come from a power "higher" than the government - Creator God.
- 2. There are no second class citizens if each person is equal because each is made in the image of God.
- 3. You can live in freedom with few laws if the populous keeps internal laws because they are conscious of their accountability to a higher power.





1. Its authority comes from and through the people (not from God directly).

"We hold these Truths to be selfevident, that all Men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, & the Pursuit of Happiness: —That to secure these Rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just Powers from the Consent of the governed:"

The Declaration of Independence 23

2. Its foundation was rooted in the Enlightenment's freedom from external authority and the "common knowledge" of "nature's god."

Matthew 11:12

"From the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven suffers violence, and violent men **take it by force**."

Was the American Revolution justified? Consider:

- ✓ The N.T. emphasis on submission to gov. (The Apostles argued for submission to Nero's Rome, suggesting that rebellion against England was problematic - Rom.13: 1 Pet.2.)
- ✓ The argument for taxing the colonies. (The British were protecting the colonialists from the French and Indians at great expense.)
- ✓ The meaning of "freedom" in Christ. (When the colonialists cited the Bible in justifying the American revolution they redefined "freedom".)

If there was a valid argument for the American revolution it did not come from the Bible but rather from the Enlightenment.

The nation's capital is full of Biblical inscriptions, but they center attention on the moral law and Moses not the Gospel and Jesus.




In the chamber of the U.S. House of Representatives

Was (is) America a Christian nation?


Culturally YES & NO!








Another place where we can get off track




- 1. The American system embraces core values that are conflicted and call for tolerance, understanding, and mutual respect.

- Note: The founding documents reflect Enlightenment values more than the Bible nature's god, common grace, humanism.


