John 1

"19 Now this was John's testimony when the Jews of Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to ask him who he was. 20 He did not fail to confess, but confessed freely, "I am not the Christ." 21 They asked him, "Then who are you? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No." 22 Finally they said, "Who are you? Give us an answer to take back to those who sent us. 
Jesus' nature - both divine and human

Philippians 2

"6... although He existed in the form of God, (he) did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, 7 but emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men. 8 And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. 9 Therefore also God highly exalted Him, and bestowed on Him the name which is above every name, 10 that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those who are in heaven, and on earth, and under the earth, 11 and that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."

Hebrews 1

"1 God, after He spoke long ago to the fathers in the prophets in many portions and in many ways, 2 in these last days has spoken to us in His Son, whom He appointed heir of all things, through whom also He made the world. 3 And He is the radiance of His glory and the exact representation of His nature, and upholds all things by the word of His power. When He had made purification of sins, He sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high; 4 having become as much better than the angels, as He has inherited a more excellent name than they. 5 For to which of the angels did He ever say, "Thou art My Son, Today I have begotten Thee?" He is the unique Son of God!

"But the Lord was pleased to crush him, putting him to grief; if he would render himself as a guilt offering."


1 Peter 1

The Law of Moses revealed both:





Jesus' ethical example, insightful teaching, and miracles are not what makes him special!

It is his death and resurrection!

"30 This is the one I meant when I said, 'A man who comes after me has surpassed me because he was before me.' 31 I myself did not know him, but the reason I came baptizing with water was that he might be revealed to Israel." 32 Then John gave this testimony: "I saw the Spirit come down from heaven as a dove and remain on him. 33 I would not have known him, except that the one who sent me to baptize with water told me, 'The man on whom you see the Spirit come down and remain is he who will **baptize with the Holy Spirit**.' 34 I have seen and I testify that this is the Son of God."

The Lord God who is the Lamb of God gives the Spirit of God

- John probably knew Jesus as his relative but not as the Christ.
- John's baptizing of the believing remnant within Israel would provide occasion for the true Messiah to be revealed, as he was by a descending dove.
- The baptism with the Spirit is key to the promise of the Gospel blessing given to Abraham in Genesis 12.

Galatians 3

"13 Christ redeemed us from the curse of the Law, having become a curse for us – for it is written, "Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree" – 14 in order that in Christ Jesus **the blessing of Abraham** might come to the Gentiles, so that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith."

The forming of the Body of Christ is at the heart of the "Baptism with the Spirit."

Galatians 4

"26 For you are all sons of God through **faith** in Christ Jesus. 27 For all of you who were **baptized** into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. 28 There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free man, there is neither male nor female; for **you are all one in Christ Jesus**."

I Corinthians 12:13

"For by one Spirit we were all baptized into **one body**, whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free, and **we were all** made to drink of one spirit."

What is the Baptism with the Holy Spirit?

The term baptism when applied to water refers to an initial act, which is never repeated and is used to refer to the introduction of a person into a new sphere of relationship.

It is perhaps best to interpret the phrase, baptism with the Spirit, as referring to the INITIAL WORK OF CHRIST IN UNITING BELIEVERS TO HIMSELF AND TO ONE ANOTHER THROUGH THE PERMANENT INDWELLING OF HIS HOLY SPIRIT

When did Jesus give his Spirit to his followers?

John 20

"21 Jesus therefore said to them again, "Peace be with you; as the Father has sent Me, I also send you." 22 And when He had said this, He breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. 23 "If you forgive the sins of any, their sins have been forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they have been retained.""

This verse does not say that the disciples received the Holy Spirit.

It records Jesus' words relating to two facts:

- 1. "As the Father has sent me, I also send you" (vs. 21),
- 2. "Receive the Holy Spirit" (vs. 22).

Although the great commission of John 20:21 (*Matt. 28:18-20; Mark 16:15*) was given before Pentecost, it was not initiated and carried out until after Pentecost, so it was with the receiving of the Holy Spirit.

This is a prophetic statement of what would take place at Pentecost. The Greek grammar of (Receive) can have a futuristic sense as in John 13:31; 15:6; Rev.10:7.

John made it clear that the Spirit could not be given until AFTER Jesus left. John 7:39;16:7; Acts 2:33.

John 7:39

"But this He spoke of the Spirit, whom those who believed in Him were to receive; for the Spirit was not yet given, because Jesus was not yet glorified."

John 16:7

"But I tell you the truth, it is to your advantage that I go away; for if I do not go away, the Helper shall not come to you; but if I go, I will send Him to you."

Acts 2:33

"Therefore having been exalted to the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, He has poured forth this which you both see and hear."

Jesus did not leave us only with a new religious system!

Jesus leaves all believers with an intimate, relationship with him & each other through his indwelling Spirit!

The Gospel must be proclaimed It is not acquired by private meditation or forced by political / military power.

The Gospel message should address three questions:

Who is Jesus?

Why is Jesus significant?

What difference does it make?
