
American congregations

- 1,200 megachurch have 2000 people or more (56 are in Houston & Dallas, Texas)




Why are some churches big?





John 1

"35 Again the next day John was standing with two of his disciples, 36 and he looked upon Jesus as He walked, and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God!" 37 And the two disciples heard him speak, and they followed Jesus. 38 And Jesus turned, and beheld them following, and said to them, "What do you seek?" And they said to Him, "Rabbi (which translated means Teacher), where are You staying?" 39 He said to them, "Come, and you will see." They came therefore and saw where He was staying; and they stayed with Him that day, for it was about the tenth hour. 40 One of the two who heard John speak, and followed Him, was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. 41 He found first his own brother Simon, and said to him, "We have found the Messiah" (which translated means Christ). 42 He brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him, and said, "You are Simon the son of John; you shall be called Cephas" (which is translated Peter)."

"43 The next day He purposed to go forth into Galilee, and He found Philip. And Jesus said to him, "Follow Me." 44 Now Philip was from Bethsaida, of the city of Andrew and Peter. 45 Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found Him of whom Moses in the Law and also the Prophets wrote, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph." 46 And Nathanael said to him, "Can any good thing come out of Nazareth?" Matthew 4

"18 And walking by the Sea of Galilee, He saw two brothers, Simon who was called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea; for they were fishermen. 19 And He said to them, "Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men." 20 **And they immediately left the nets, and followed Him.** 21 And going on from there He saw two other brothers, James the son of Zebedee, and John his brother, in the boat with Zebedee their father, mending their nets; and He called them. 22 And they immediately left the boat and their father, and followed Him."

This probably took place some time after the initial response to follow Jesus (John 1). Note that Simon is here already called Peter.

Disciples left John, their vocation, and family to follow Jesus.

Three observations of good spiritual leadership

- 1. Don't manipulate. Let the Word of the Cross draw the sheep.
- 2. Don't marginalize. Welcome & encourage diversity in Christ.
- 3. **Don't monopolize.** Be King & Kingdom centered not pastor & congregation centered.

Fishing of men in God's Kingdom is strictly catch and release.

- 1. Fish for sheep with the Gospel.
 - Not political or military force.
 - · Not fun and games.

Ephesians 4

"15 but speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in all aspects into Him, who is the head, even Christ, 16 from whom the whole body, being fitted and held together by that which every joint supplies, according to the proper working of each individual part, causes the growth of the body for the building up of itself in love."

 We must edify the Body of Christ by speaking truth in love and respecting the diverse functions of the Body.

3. Wolves & shepherds both love sheep.

- John lost his disciples to Jesus.
- Keeping OUR sheep may be a bad idea.

John 3:30

"He must increase, but I must decrease."

Matthew 14:10

"He sent and had John beheaded in the prison."

 When we point people to Jesus we are pointing them away from us.

1 Corinthians 1

"11 For I have been informed concerning you, my brethren, by Chloe's people, that there are quarrels among you. 12 Now I mean this, that each one of you is saying, "I am of Paul," and "I of Apollos," and "I of Cephas," and "I of Christ." 13 Has Christ been divided? Paul was not crucified for you, was he? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul?"

The sheep may be in different pastures but they all wear the same brand.

Note that the first disciples :

- 1. Left John the Baptist
- 2. Left their vocations and families

What might Jesus expect us to leave if we were to follow him?

Just about anything and everything that takes on a Messianic role in our life.

- Our toys and tools.
- Our mate and family.
- · Our vocation and hobbies.
- · Our positions and possessions.
- Our social, political, economic comforts.

- Shepherds that lean on the sheep for their own wellbeing become wolves and need to to leave the sheep to Jesus.
- Sheep that have a toxic attachment to an under-shepherd need to follow Jesus by breaking away from controlling leaders.
- Any confusion between the values of the culture of this age and that of the Kingdom of God must be clarified.
- All of us who have a messianic attachment to people, possessions, plans, & passions need to keep this stuff from displacing Jesus as our Messiah.

Our functional Messiah?

- · What do we make our greatest sacrifices for?
- What governs our biggest decisions?
- What are we most thankful for?
- What motivates us to get up in the morning?
- · What medicates our pain in hard times?
- What monopolizes our time when we relax?
