


The essence of the Incarnation.

Matthew 1:23

"And they shall call His name Immanuel, which translated means, "God with us"."







John 6

"16 Now when evening came, His disciples went down to the sea, 17 and after getting into a boat, they started to cross the sea to Capernaum. And it had already become dark, and Jesus had not yet come to them. 18 And the sea began to be stirred up because a strong wind was blowing. 19 When therefore they had rowed about three or four miles, **they beheld Jesus walking on the sea and drawing near to the boat; and they were frightened**. 20 But He said to them, "It is I (**I AM**); do not be afraid." 21 They were willing therefore to receive Him into the boat; and immediately the boat was at the land to which they were going."

The context

- Jesus had withdrawn from the disciples to be alone.
- The disciples cross the sea alone late in the day.
- It is dark, the sea is rough, and they are afraid as they see what appears to be a ghost.

Note that John leaves out (from Matt.14:22-33 and Mk.6:45-52)

- Jesus COMMANDING the disciples to cross the sea on their own.
- PETER walking on the water.
- Notations of the disciples' WORSHIP Matt.14:33
 and HARD HEARTS. Mk 6:52

NOTE: this may be just an expansion of the "fear" theme. 12

Mark 6 "37 But He answered and said to them, "You give them something to eat!" "

"45 And immediately He made His disciples get into the boat and go ahead of Him to the other side to Bethsaida," 13

Too many Christians come on board the Christian life expecting a luxury cruise or smooth ride only to end up lost, in a storm, off road, at night Wondering where Jesus is?



A deep sense of duty A sense of inadequacy A judgmental audience. The "perfect storm" for stress Sounds like some churches. John 6 & Mark 6.15

Implications


- Following Jesus may be exciting but not without times of exhaustion and stress.
- Jesus sends his followers into harm's way alone but not without opportunity to develop insight and faith.
- Jesus does not shield the disciples from stressful circumstances but neither does he leave them without a resource.
- What do we do when we "seem to be" alone, on rough seas, in the dark?

Applications

- 1. Don't be surprised by life's stressful circumstances.
 - Jesus not only permits but some times prescribes them.
 - We work hard and have many tools to keep bad circumstances at bay.
 - But we cannot avoid many of them.
- 2. Following Jesus is 4x4 drive only.
 - Most of the way will be off road.
 - Being off road is not the same as being in the ditch or shipwrecked.



3. It is the Spirit of Christ IN US that is our security (not God's work outside us).

- God can change our circumstances but He is more glorified by the way we respond to them.
- Christ in us is the hope of glory. Col.1:27

"22 The next day the multitude that stood on the other side of the sea saw that there was no other small boat there, except one, and that Jesus had not entered with His disciples into the boat, but that His disciples had gone away alone. 23 There came other small boats from Tiberias near to the place where they ate the bread after the Lord had given thanks. 24 When the multitude therefore saw that Jesus was not there, nor His disciples, they themselves got into the small boats, and came to Capernaum, seeking Jesus. 25 And when they found Him on the other side of the sea, they said to Him, "Rabbi, when did You get here?" 26 Jesus answered them and said, "Truly,truly, I say to you, you seek me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate of the loaves and were filled." 21






Implications

- When Jesus blesses us in tangible ways we too often see this as the end game.
- Jesus takes a risk whenever he blesses us lest we don't hang around for the main course.
- Why are we following Jesus?
