John 8

"21 He said therefore again (Jn.7:34) to them, "I go away, and you shall seek me, and shall die in your sin; where I am going, you cannot come. 22 Therefore the Jews were saying, "Surely He will not kill Himself, will He, since He says, 'Where I am going, you cannot come'?"

 Where was Jesus going that they could not follow and why would they die in their sins as they continued to seek Messiah but reject Jesus?

What is the point that Jesus makes?

- Jesus' impending death would be a unique sacrifice for sin that no one else could duplicate.
- A repeated phrase in John 8:21-30 is "dying in your sin." (vs.21, 24)
- Jesus' death would remove the curse of sin from God's people.
- What kind of Messiah were the Pharisees seeking?
 - 1. A social / political reformer?
 - 2. A perfect Pharisee a model of piety?

· What is the essence of Christian faith?

Jesus' death is a mistake.


Jesus' death is an model.

So what is the lesson for us?

1. What are we trusting God FOR?

- A happy personal life here and now.
- A loving environment justice and peace.
- A love, peace, and joy that is not tied to our circumstances.

2. What KIND of freedom are we seeking?

- A freedom from pain and suffering.
- A freedom to realize our dreams.
- A freedom to love others and reflect the image of God.

23 And He was saying to them, "You are from below, I am from above; you are of this world, I am not of this world. 24 I said therefore to you, that you shall die in your sins; for unless you believe that I am He, you shall die in your sins."

"25 And so they were saying to Him, "Who are You?" Jesus said to them, "What have I been saying to you from the beginning? 26 I have many things to speak and to judge concerning you, but He who sent Me is true; and the things which I heard from Him, these I speak to the world." 27 They did not realize that He had been speaking to them about the Father. 28 Jesus therefore said, "When you lift up the Son of Man, then you will know that I am He, and I do nothing on My own initiative, but I speak these things as the Father taught Me. 29 And He who sent Me is with Me; He has not left Me alone, for I always do the things that are pleasing to Him. 30 As He spoke these things, many came to believe in Him." 15

Observations


1. Faith in "something" is a universal characteristic of humans.

Humans are inescapably religious - either formally or informally.

2. The Pharisees had a religion that was "from below" - focused on this life.

Their faith was in the Law, their hope was in the temporal, and their love was for this life.

- 3. Jesus warns them that without faith in him they will remain in their sin.
- 4. Another repeated phrase in John 8:21-30 is "I am He" (vs.24, 28).



Two important truths.

- 1. Provision for salvation is complete at the Cross of Jesus.
- "Where I am going, you cannot go." Only Jesus could make atonement for sin.
- 2. Procurement of salvation is completed through faith in Jesus.
- "Unless you believe that I am He, you shall die in your sins". Only we can exercise faith so as to be saved.

So what is the lesson for us?

- 1. Shield your heart from these common objects of faith for your soul.
 - Self follow your heart
 - Science follow the experts
 - Society follow the crowd
 - Sentiment follow tradition

2. Keep a clear distinction between three common objects of faith:




Surrogate (Die for our sin)
