# Unbelief is sometimes ascribed to man's willful suppression of the truth.

### Romans 1

"18 For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who suppress the truth in unrighteousness, . . . 21 For even though they knew God, they did not honor Him as God, or give thanks; but they became futile in their speculations, and their foolish heart was darkened."

## Unbelief is sometimes ascribed to the condition of the heart.

Matthew 13

"3 And He spoke many things to them in parables, saying, "Behold, the sower went out to sow; 4 and as he sowed, some seeds **fell beside the road**, and the birds came and ate them up. 5 And others **fell upon the rocky places**, where they did not have much soil; and immediately they sprang up, because they had no depth of soil. 6 But when the sun had risen, they were scorched; and because they had no root, they withered away. 7 And others **fell among the thorns**, and the thorns came up and choked them out. 8 And others **fell on the good soil**, and yielded a crop, some a hundredfold, some sixty, and some thirty.

9 He who has ears, let him hear."3

## Unbelief is sometimes ascribed to a person hardening their heart.

#### Psalm 95

## Unbelief is sometimes ascribed to having not heard the Gospel.

### Romans 10

"13 for "Whoever will call upon the name of the Lord will be saved." 14 How then shall they call upon Him in whom they have not believed? And how shall they believe in Him whom they have not heard? And how shall they hear without a preacher? 15 And how shall they preach unless they are sent? Just as it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring glad tidings of good things!""

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## Unbelief is sometimes ascribed to **the work of Satan**.

### 2 Corinthians 4

"3 And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing, 4 in whose case **the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelieving**, that they might not see the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God."

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## **Election**

predestined to salvation by God's sovereign choice (not human will).

> The Greek word means "chosen" or "picked out."



Does God harden the hearts of some so that they will not and can not believe?

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## Divine Election seems clearly Biblical and beyond our understanding.

#### Romans 9

"16 So then it does not depend on the man who wills or the man who runs, but on God who has mercy. . . 18 So then He has mercy on whom He desires, and He hardens whom He desires. 19 You will say to me then, "Why does He still find fault? For who resists His will?" 20 On the contrary, who are you, O man, who answers back to God? The thing molded will not say to the molder, "Why did you make me like this," will it?"

Who are the objects of God's redemption through Christ - the elect only or all (conditioned on faith)?

## Election

How is God's choice related to human choice?

## Three views of Divine Election to salvation.

- 1. God has chosen from before creation of the world to save a limited number of individuals to be ransomed from sin and given faith to be justified through Christ.
- 2. God has elected Christ and all who willfully choose to place their faith in him.
- 3. God provided redemption for all sinners and ultimately all will be redeemed.

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## My objectives in this lesson

- 1. It is not to refute Calvinism.
- 2. It is to help those who equate Calvinism with orthodoxy to see that Scripture is not as clear on this issue as they think.
- 3. It is to show that Calvinist's are not the only Christians who have a high view of God's grace and sovereignty.

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### John 12

Otherwise they might see with their eyes,
Hear with their ears,
Understand with their hearts,
And return and be healed.""

spoke, "Lord, who has believed our report? And to who has the arm of the Lord been revealed?" 39 For this cause they could not believe, for Isaiah said again, 40 "He has blinded their eyes, and he hardened their heart; lest they see with their eyes, and perceive with their heart, and be converted, and I heal them."

2. The hardening was the work of Isaiah whose preaching solidified unbelief.


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## **Consideration #1**

Could God's love and respect for them limit His absolute control of them?



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
### Consideration #3

Is God's loving, sovereign, power a function of His KNOWLEDGE?


### Psalm 139

## Consideration #5

Is God's loving, sovereign, power in sync with His FOREKNOWLEDGE.

Like a grandmaster in chess, God can see how history is set up to enable certain things to unfold, and He uses this as a part of His providential plan.

"By faith we understand that the worlds (aions "ages") were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was not made out of things which are visible."


## What about Romans 9?

"9 For this is a word of promise: "At this time I will come, and Sarah shall have a son." 10 And not only this, but there was Rebekah also, when she had conceived twins by one man, our father Isaac; 11 for though the twins were not yet born, and had not done

anything good or bad, in order that God's purpose according to His choice might stand, not because of works, but because of Him who calls, 12 it was said to her, "The older will serve the younger." (Gen.25:23) 13 Just as it is written, "Jacob I loved, but Esau I hated." (Mal.1:2-4)

# Our presuppositions shape our interpretation.

- Paul is addressing the relationship between Jew and Gentile in God's plan. (not individual salvation.)
- The hardening of Pharaoh is a part of his role in Israel's story. (not his salvation.)
- The O.T. quotations clearly speak of Israel and Edom. (represented by Jacob and Esau.)




## Two nations Israel & Edom (not individuals) are in view.

#### Malachi 1

"1 The oracle of the word of the Lord **to Israel** through Malachi. 2 "I have loved you." says the Lord. But you say, "How have You loved **us**?" "Was not Esau Jacob's brother?" declares the Lord. "Yet **I** have loved Jacob; 3 but I have hated Esau, and I have made his mountains a desolation and appointed his inheritance for the jackals of the wilderness." 4 Though **Edom** says, "We have been beaten down, but we will return and build up the ruins"; thus says the Lord of hosts, "**They** may build, but I will tear down; and men will call them the wicked territory, and **the people** toward whom the Lord is indignant forever."

#### Romans 9

"15 For He says to Moses, " I will have mercy on whom I have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I have compassion." 16 So then it does not depend on the man who wills or the man who runs, but on God who has mercy. 17 For the Scripture says to Pharaoh, "For this very purpose I raised you up, to demonstrate My power in you and that My name might be proclaimed throughout the whole earth." 18 So then He has mercy on whom He desires, and He hardens whom He desires. 19 You will say to me then, "Why does He still find fault? For who resists His will?" 20 On the contrary, who are you, O man, who answers back to God? The thing molded will not say to the molder, "Why did you make me like this," will it?"



"Calvinism emphasizes divine sovereignty and free grace; Arminianism emphasizes human responsibility. The one restricts the saving grace to the elect; the other extends it to all men on the condition of faith. Both are right in what they assert; both are wrong in what they deny. If one important truth is pressed to the exclusion of another truth of equal importance, it becomes an error, and loses its hold upon the conscience. The Bible gives us a theology which is more human than Calvinism, and more divine than Arminianism, and more Christian than either of them."
