1. Essence of the Gospel.

"32 And they were on the road, going up to Jerusalem, and Jesus was walking on ahead of them; and they were amazed, and those who followed were fearful. And again He took the twelve aside and began to tell them what was going to happen to Him, 33 saying, "Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be delivered to the chief priests and the scribes; and they will condemn Him to death, and will deliver Him to the Gentiles. 34 And they will mock Him and spit upon Him, and scourge Him, and kill Him, and three days later He will rise again."













Mark 1:1

Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or to be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?" 39 And they said to Him, "We are able." 1 Corinthians 1

"26 For consider your calling, brethren, that there were not many wise according to the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble; 27 but God has chosen the foolish things of the world to shame the wise, and God has chosen the weak things of the world to shame the things which are strong, 28 and the base things of the world and the despised, God has chosen, the things that are not, that He might nullify the things that are, 29 that no man should boast before God."

What is "over the line"?

- ✓ Disrespect for the priesthood of believers in church, & family.
- ✓ Micro-managing, marginalizing, misrepresenting, and manipulating, others with guilt and fear.
- ✓ Exploiting others for selfish gain "fleecing the sheep."
- ✓ Slow to listen, quick to speak, and quick to anger.

The perfect storm for abuse Culture of Entitlement & Controlling Temperament Inner Insecurity Controlling Temperament Position of Authority

How do disciples lead?

- ✓ Respecting the image of God and Holy Spirit in every believer.
- ✓ Speaking the truth in love through grace, not guilt or fear.
- ✓ Sacrificing personal interest from a position of strength and security.
- ✓ Being quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to anger.

Example of Jesus being IN but not OF the world.

Disciples of Jesus are disciples of the Cross, allowing it to shape their faith, hope, love, and **ministry**.
