
False expectations are a great challenge to faith.

- Much of God's work is dramatic in the Bible.
- Should we not expect the same? (conversion, deliverance, church growth, answer to prayer)

This was a challenge for the early church as well.

1. How are we to explain the lack of response to the Gospel by the Jewish leaders?

- If Jesus was the Messiah all Israel should have recognized him.
- The Jewish leaders rejected Jesus.
- Only a small remnant would believe.



2. How are we to explain the lack of dramatic change for Israel with Jesus' coming?

- The O.T. prophets taught that Messiah's coming was to bring back Israel's glory.
- Nothing seemed to have changed for the nation Israel.

Parable of the Mustard Seed

"26 And He was saying, "The kingdom of God is like a man who casts seed upon the soil; 27 and he goes to bed at night and gets up by day, and the seed sprouts and grows - how, he himself does not know. 28 The soil produces crops by itself; first the blade, then the head, then the mature grain in the head. 29 But when the crop permits, he immediately puts in the sickle, because the harvest has come.""


What is the sower's responsibility? To sow at the start and reap at the end. What is the soil's responsibility? To sprout, grow to maturity, & bear fruit over time. What is the point for us? Be patient, the kingdom is a process over time.


Parable of the Mustard Seed


"30 And He said, "How shall we picture the kingdom of God, or by what parable shall we present it? 31 It is like a mustard seed, which, when sown upon the soil, though it is smaller than all the seeds that are upon the soil, 32 yet when it is sown, it grows up and becomes larger than all the garden plants and forms large branches; so that THE BIRDS OF THE AIR can NEST UNDER ITS SHADE.""

What is the point for us?

- 1. A very small beginning produces a large result.
- 2. The kingdom will be so large that it will bless many.
- 3. As in the first parable this will take time requiring both faith and patience.







The parable as a veil

"³³ With many such parables He was speaking the word to them, so far as they were able to hear it; ³⁴ and He did not speak to them without a parable; but He was explaining everything privately to His own disciples."

Seeing and hearing from the right frame of reference.




Romans 8
