Three critical points of tension in Christendom

Scientific - Material / Spiritual

Salvific - Law / Grace

Social - Church / State

All three are tied to the relationship of the Old and New Covenants. One of the gravest mistakes Christians make in Biblical ethics is to misread and misapply the Old Testament teaching.

Differences between Ancient Israel and the USA

- ✓ Israel was under a God initiated covenant while the USA was based on a human social contract.
- ✓ Under Moses, Israel was a temporal, material, political, Kingdom while under Jesus the Kingdom was spiritual and not of this world.
- √ The Kingdom under Israel was limited geographical, ethnically, and nationally, while the USA is diverse, pluralistic, and open to all.
- ✓ If there is a parallel to ancient Israel today, it is the church more than the USA.
- √ The Biblical standards for the state are not as strict as for the covenant people of faith.

1 Corinthians 5

"9 I wrote you in my letter not to associate with immoral people; 10 I did not at all mean with the immoral people of this world, or with the covetous and swindlers, or with idolaters; for then you would have to go out of the world. 11 But actually, I wrote to you not to associate with any so-called brother if he should be an immoral person, or covetous, or an idolater, or a reviler, or a drunkard, or a swindler — not even to eat with such a one. 12 For what have I to do with judging outsiders? Do you not judge those who are within the church? 13 But those who are outside, God judges. Remove the wicked man from among yourselves."

John 18:36

IT IS THE WORD OF THE CROSS.


1 Corinthians 1

"18 For the word of the cross is to those who are perishing foolishness, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. 19 For it is written, "I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, And the cleverness of the clever I will set aside." 20 Where is the wise man? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? 21 For since in the wisdom of God the world through its wisdom did not come to know God, God was well-pleased through the foolishness of the message preached to save those who believe. 22 For indeed Jews ask for signs, and Greeks search for wisdom; 23 but we preach Christ crucified, to Jews a stumbling block, and to Gentiles foolishness, 24 but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. 25 Because the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men."

1 Corinthians 1

"26 For consider your calling, brethren, that there were not many wise according to the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble; 27 but God has chosen the foolish things of the world to shame the wise, and God has chosen the weak things of the world to shame the things which are strong, 28 and the base things of the world and the despised, God has chosen, the things that are not, that He might nullify the things that are, 29 that no man should boast before God. 30 But by His doing you are in Christ Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification, and redemption, 31 that, just as it is written, "Let him who boasts, boast in the Lord.""

✓ Christians are called not for their nobility or worldly power but to be a mockery of it.



How is America unique?


- ✓ America does not have a state religion but it does have an ethical heritage that reflects "Judeo-Christian" tradition.

- ✓ America reaches out benevolently to all who are in distress around the world.


