Challenging God's right to define the rules and keep the books of the universe.

Autonomous Pride is a separatist spirit.

 it places itself above others, including God.

Luke 15:25-32

"31 And he said to him, "My child, you have always been with me, and all that is mine is yours. 32 But we had to be merry and rejoice, for this brother of yours was dead and has begun to live, and was lost and has been found."

Narcissistic

Pride is a self-centered spirit.

- it has little energy or empathy for the honor of anyone but self.

Luke 15:25-32

"25 Now his older son was in the field, and when he came and approached the house, he heard music and dancing. 26 And he summoned one of the servants and began inquiring what these things might be. 27 And he said to him, "Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fattened calf, because he has received him back safe and sound." 28 But he became angry, and was not willing to go in; and his father came out and began entreating him. 29 But he answered and said to his father, "Look! 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Competitive Pride is a superficial, scorekeeping spirit.

- it is always keeping score so as to prove the superiority of the self.

Pride is not:

1.

Seeking or valuing the praise of others so much as being aloof from their opinions.

Finding in others something that we admire so much as projecting our ego on them.

Something that threatens God so much as robing us of fellowship with God & others.

4.

Making a big deal of our lowly estate so much as being consumed with self-image.
