if the handling of it is faulty.

yet be Satan’s scribe in using it.

2 Peter 1

“²⁰ But know this first of all, that no prophecy of Scripture is a matter of one’s own interpretation (explanation), ²¹ for **no prophecy was ever made by an act of human will**, but men moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.”

The Word of God is not authoritative when in service to the will of man.

The greatest abuse of the Word of God is to assume the human reader or hearer is inherent in the reading or hearing.

Some common mistakes

1. The devotional crystal ball - read till you feel good or find a verse that “has some meaning for you”.

- a. Seeking “a word from God”.
- b. Open the Bible and start reading anywhere.
- c. Relate what is read to a personal situation.



“The Spirit gave me a verse.”

Ezekiel 3:8

“Now you, son of man, listen to what I am speaking to you; do not be rebellious like that rebellious house. **Open your mouth and eat what I am giving you.**”

Ecclesiastes 10:2

“A wise man’s heart directs him toward the **right**, but the foolish man’s heart directs him toward the **left**.”



Some common mistakes

2. Encrypted meanings - hidden from the normal reading or hearing of the message.

The law of first mention - the first time a word is used in the Bible gives its true meaning throughout the rest of the Bible.

Bible codes - encrypted meaning that is found in the arrangement of letters or words.

The law of first mention

Genesis 3:1





Some common mistakes

4. Disregard literary genre - historical narrative, poetry, epistles, gospels, wisdom, apocalyptic, etc.

Most common Biblical genre

- Narratives** - telling the story of what happened or to illustrate a point.
- Gospels** - a combination of Narrative and Epistle.
- Epistles** - letters for the purpose of teaching.



- Prophecy** - oracles to exhort, foretell, or comfort.
- Apocalypse** - a combination of Prophecy and Poetry.
- Poetry** - vivid figurative language to artistically send a message.

A poetic narrative in a Gospel

Luke 16:23

“22 Now it came about that the poor man died and he was carried away by the angels to Abraham’s bosom; and the rich man also died and was buried. 23 And in Hades he lifted up his eyes, being in torment, and saw Abraham far away, and Lazarus in his bosom.”

Some common mistakes

5. Read the Bible through lenses of “modern culture” - Defining Biblical inerrancy in ways that do not allow for the human authorship, customs, and writing styles of the time.

Mark 1:2 (Matt.3:3)

“As it is **written in Isaiah** the prophet, ‘Behold, I send My messenger before Your face, Who will prepare Your way;’” (**Mal.3:1**)

The N.T. writers often quote from the O.T. Septuagint (**Greek translation** of the Hebrew).

Romans 10:20

“I have **shown myself** to those who did not ask for me”

Isaiah 65:1

“I was **ready to be sought by** those who did not ask for me”

Some terms have a broader meaning than the English translation would suggest.

Psalms 78:69

“the earth which is founded **forever**”

2 Peter 3:10

“the earth and its works **will be burned up.**”

Jeremiah 3:12

“I **will not be angry forever**”

Jeremiah 17:4

“For you have kindled a fire in **My anger which will burn forever.**” 25
