1 Thessalonians 3

“⁹ For what **thanks** can we render to God for you in return for all the joy with which we rejoice before our God on your account,

¹⁰ as we night and day keep praying most earnestly **that we may see your face, and may complete what is lacking in your faith?** ¹¹ Now may our God and Father Himself and Jesus our Lord **direct our way to you;**

¹² and may the Lord cause you to **increase and abound in love** for one another, and for all men, just as we also do for you;

¹³ so that He may **establish your hearts** unblamable in **holiness** before our God and Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all His saints.”

Let others know that you thank God for them. **Turn thankfulness into encouragement.**

Be specific about what you are thankful for. **Be conscious of your blessings.**

Wisdom is our path to discerning God's will. **Seek wisdom more than special revelation.**




Knowing the love of God and the wonder of grace sets us free for powerful living. **Pray for an intimate encounter with God's love and grace.**

What do Paul's prayers tell us?

Spiritual growth is needed and expected. **Make spiritual growth a priority.**

Pray for the peace of God. **Make reconciliation a priority.**
