
"The cup that I drink you shall drink; and you shall be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized."



The apostles challenge disciples to look back.

Hebrews 12

"1 Therefore, . . . let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, 2 fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross. despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God."

> Jesus Christ sets the example as he "endured the cross". Hebrews 9

"the baptism with which I am baptized"

Hebrews 9 (interpretive paraphrase)

"13 If the blood and ashes of animals sanctifies the outer person under the Old Covenant, 14 how much more will the **blood** of Christ, that is perfectly holy and offered through the eternal Spirit, cleanse the inner person from worthless rituals that are only symbols. This prepares us to serve the living God. 15 As mediator of a New Covenant, Jesus has redeemed all those who have been called to receive the promise of the eternal inheritance."

Hebrews 9 (interpretive paraphrase)


"16 A will (contract) is linked to a death. 17 It is activated only after a person dies. 18 The Old Covenant was not inaugurated without **blood**. 19 When Moses gave us the Law, he took the **blood** of animals, and sprinkled both the tablets and all the people 20 saying, "This is the **blood** of the covenant which God commanded you." 21 And in the same way he sprinkled both the tabernacle and all the vessels of the ministry with the **blood**. 22 And according to the Law, one may almost say, all things are cleansed with **blood**, and without shedding of **blood** there is no forgiveness."

7 8 9

Hebrews 9 (interpretive paraphrase)

"23 The Old Covenant sacrifices were necessary until the perfect sacrifice came. 24 For Christ entered into heaven itself, to appear in the presence of God for us; 25 offering His blood, 26 at the consummation of the ages. His mission was to put away sin by the sacrifice of Himself once for all. 27 It is appointed for men to die once and after this comes judgment, 28 so Christ also, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, shall appear a second time for salvation without a need to redeem from sin, to those who eagerly await Him."





Peter was crucified head down.

Andrew was bound to death.

James, son of Zebedee, was beheaded. (Acts 12:1-9).

John was banished (Rev. 1-9) & boiled alive?

Phillip was crucified.

Bartholomew was beaten, crucified, & beheaded.

Thomas was run through by a lance.

Matthew was slain by the sword.

James, son of Alphaeus, was beaten to death.

Thaddeus was shot to death by arrows.

Simon was crucified.

Judas Iscariot hung himself (Matt.27:3-10).

Matthias was martyred.

Paul was executed.

11 12 10

1 Corinthians 11

"23 For I received from the Lord that which I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus in the night in which he was betrayed took bread; 24 and when He had given thanks, He broke it, and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in me." 25 In the same remembrance of way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, this cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, as often as vou drink it, in remembrance of me." 26 For as often as you

eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim

the Lord's death until He comes."

A point to ponder

Philippians 2

"5 Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus, 6 who, although he existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, 7 but emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men. 8 And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross."

We will bear a cross (suffering) as we accept delayed gratification in this life awaiting glory in the life to come.

Romans 8

"18 For I consider that the **sufferings** of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the **glory that is to be revealed to us.** 19 For the anxious longing of the creation waits eagerly for the revealing of the sons of God. 20 For the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will, but because of Him who subjected it, in hope 21 that the creation itself also will be set free from its slavery to corruption into the freedom of the glory of the children of God."

Romans 8

"22 For we know that the whole creation groans and suffers the pains of childbirth together until now. 23 And not only this, but also we ourselves, having the first fruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting eagerly for our adoption as sons, the redemption of our body. 24 For in hope we have been saved, but hope that is seen is not hope; for why does one also hope for what he sees? 25 But if we hope for what we do not see, with perseverance we wait eagerly for it."

Revelation 21:1

"Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth passed away,"

Suggestions

Limit your responsibilities to things that you can and should control.
