NOTE: It's not enough to be salt. We must be salty.





Worldly Joy

Godly Joy

Dependent upon "good times", what we see and how we feel with our natural senses. Exists even in "hard times", as we see and walk through life by faith in what is to come.

James 1

"2 **Consider it all joy**, my brethren, when you encounter various trials, 3 knowing that the testing of your faith produces endurance."

Joy is a CHOICE we must make while in (not only after) the midst of it all.

We are called to rejoice in the midst of it all.

John 15

"10 If you keep My commandments, you will abide in My love; just as I have kept My Father's commandments, and abide in His love. 11 These things I have spoken to you, **that My joy may be in you, and that your joy may be made full**."

- Jesus promises joy to his followers.
- Jesus joy is the model for our joy.
- Jesus joy came in "the midst of it all".
- Jesus joy had "salt" all over it.

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We are called to rejoice in the midst of it all.

1 Peter 4:13

"but to the degree that you **share the sufferings of Christ, keep on rejoicing; so** that also at the revelation of his glory you may rejoice with exultation."

We are salty when while sharing the sufferings of Christ,

rather than whining & worrying we show faith, hope, and love.

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1. A unique Faith that is not in the ways and means of this world.

Worldly Faith

is **in** anything and everything but Christ. And is **for** things other than the kingdom. **Godly Faith** Trusts God to abide with us as we are a self-sacrificing answer to someone else's prayers.

James 2:18

"But someone may *well* say, "You have faith and I have works; show me your faith without the works, and **I will show you my** faith by my works."

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1. A unique Faith that is not in the ways and means of this world.




If we want to be salty, our faith must stand the test of fire

Bane Batman's foe in "The Dark Knight" "To create despair you first need hope."



As the church places its hope in politics and the American Dream, it is inviting cynicism, despair, and apostasy.

2. A unique Hope that is not realized to this world.

Romans 8

"24 For in hope we have been saved, **but hope that is seen is not hope**; for why does one also hope for what he sees? 25 But if we hope for what we do not see, with perseverance we wait eagerly for it."

 Aliens see beyond the blessings and trials of this life to the glory that awaits those who are in Christ.

Romans 8:18

"For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are **not worthy to be compared with the glory that is to be revealed to us.**" 25

2. A unique Hope that is not realized to this world.

2 Corinthians 4

"16 Therefore we do not lose heart, but though our outer man is decaying, yet **our inner man is being renewed** day by day. 17 For momentary, light affliction is producing for us an **eternal weight of glory** far beyond all comparison, 18 while we look not at the things which are seen, but at **the things which are not seen**; for the things which are seen are temporal, but the things which are not seen are **eternal**."

What is changing?

Not the outer things that are "seen" but the inner things that are "not seen".

2. A unique Hope that is not realized to this world.

1 Peter 3:15

"but sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts, always being ready to make a defense to everyone who asks you to give an account for the **hope that is in you**, yet with gentleness and reverence;"

If we want others to hear the Gospel, we need to display our hope so others notice and inquire.

(Don't whine and worry)

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2. A unique Hope that is not realized to this world.

Philippians 2

"5 Have this **attitude in yourselves** which was also in Christ Jesus, 6 who, although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, 7 but **emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant**, and being made in the likeness of men. 8 And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming **obedient to the point of death**, even death on a cross. 9 Therefore also God highly exalted Him, and bestowed on Him the name which is above every name,"

Following Jesus (being "salty") is **AN ATTITUDE of humble obedience.**

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3. A unique Love that is respectful of God and caring of all whom God loves.

Worldly Love

Extended to those "we need", share "our values", and earn "our admiration".

Godly Love

Given to all who bear the "image of God" and those who "need it".

John 15

"8 By this is My Father glorified, that you bear much fruit, and so prove to be My disciples. 9 Just as the Father has loved Me, I have also loved you; **abide in My love.**"

3. A unique Love that is respectful of God and caring of all whom God loves.

1 Peter 3

"8 let all be harmonious, sympathetic, brotherly, kindhearted, and humble in spirit; 9 **not returning evil for evil, or insult for insult, but giving a blessing instead**; for you were called for the very purpose that you might inherit a blessing."


If we want to be salty, we will bless those who have hurt us.

(Be a blessing to someone who does not expect it from you.)

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


