


1 Peter 4

"1 Therefore, since Christ has suffered in the flesh, arm yourselves also with the same purpose, because the one who has suffered in the flesh has ceased from sin, 2so as to live the rest of the time in the flesh no longer for human lusts, but for the will of God. 3 For the time already past is sufficient for you to have carried out the desire of the Gentiles, having pursued a course of indecent behavior, lusts, drunkenness, carousing, drinking parties, and wanton idolatries. 4 In all this, they are surprised that you do not run with them in the same excesses of debauchery, and they slander you; 5 but they will give an account to Him who is ready to judge the living and the dead. 6 For the gospel has for this purpose been preached even to those who are dead, that though they are judged in the flesh as people, they may live in the spirit according to the will of God.

7 The end of all things is near;

therefore, be of sound judgment and sober *spirit* for the purpose of prayer."


#1 Suffer injustice graciously -It's not will we suffer but HOW will we respond to it.

Romans 8

#2 Share in Christ's death willingly -In baptism, we died to our old self to live as new persons through union with Christ's death and resurrection.

"3 For the time already **past** is sufficient *for you* to have carried out the **desire** of the Gentiles, having pursued a course of indecent behavior, lusts, drunkenness, carousing, drinking parties, and wanton idolatries."

We have had time to experience the emptiness of trying to find life in all the wrong places.


Romans 2




The shadow of God's image in every human soul bears witness to a universal sense and longing for a life that cannot be met through this world.




















1 Peter 4

We know that our choices come with consequences.

6 For the gospel has for this purpose been preached even to those who are (now) dead, that though they are judged in the flesh (having died physically) as (mortal) people, they may live in the spirit according to *the will of* God."

Be assured that those who have already died will not miss out on the promises of God for those who follow Him (and those who do not).

#4 Sense the times prudently We should recognize

2 Peter 3

"3 Know this first of all, that in the last days mockers will come with their mocking, following after their own lusts, 4 and saying, "Where is the promise of His coming? For ever since the fathers fell asleep, all things continue just as they were from the beginning of creation."... 8 But do not let this one fact escape your notice, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years like one day. 9 The Lord is not slow about His promise, as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not willing for any to perish, but for all to come to repentance."

Matthew 25 (Parable of Ten Virgins)

"1 Then the kingdom of heaven will be comparable to ten virgins, who took their lamps, and went out to meet the bridegroom. 2 And five of them were foolish, and five were prudent. 3 For when the foolish took their lamps, they took no oil with them, 4 but the prudent took oil in flasks along with their lamps. 5 Now while the bridegroom was delaying, they all got drowsy and began to sleep. 6 But at midnight there was a shout, "Behold, the bridegroom! Come out to meet him." 7 Then all those virgins rose, and trimmed their lamps."

Fact #2
Be prepared to wait.

"46 Blessed is that slave whom his master finds so doing when he comes. 47 Truly I say to you, that he will put him in charge of all his possessions. 48 But if that evil slave says in his heart, 'My master is not coming for a long time,' 49 and shall begin to beat his fellow slaves and eat and drink with drunkards; 50 the master of that slave will come on a day when he does not expect him and at an hour which he does not know, 51 and shall cut him in pieces and assign him a place with the hypocrites; weeping shall be there and the gnashing of teeth."
