
Love is the MAIN thing and should come eagerly (from the heart).

1. Social respect (love of strangers)

 - This is to start in the heart but not end there.




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


Don't make your personal preferences the standard for everyone else.

1 Corinthians 3



God causes the growth.


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Romans 12








1 Corinthians 12:4-6
