

According to St. Augustine, if Christianity is to be intellectually convincing it must address two challenges:


Suffering & Science





is universal, unavoidable, undeniable, & unpredictable.

1 Peter 4:12-19 is addressing four common assumptions.

- #1 Suffering is to be "avoided" at all costs.
- #2 Our relationship with God is "transactional" we are blessed or punished based on our trust and obedience.
- #3 The Cross of Christ was "propitious" satisfying the just demands of a holy God's wrath against sin.
- #4 Being chosen and special we should expect to be treated as such.

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1 Peter 4

"12 Beloved, do not be **surprised** at the fiery ordeal among you, which comes upon you for your **testing**, as though something **strange** were happening to you;"

#1 Expand our understanding

We suffer because the whole creation is under God's curse because of Adam's sin.

Suffering can expand our perspective.

Genesis 3:17

"Cursed is the ground because of you;"

Romans 5:12

"Therefore, just as through one man sin entered into the world, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men, because all sinned"

At the root of the human dilemma is Adam's sin resulting in a divine curse not only on the human race and the whole creation.

Romans 1

"18 For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who suppress the truth in unrighteousness, ... 21 For even though they knew God, they did not honor Him as God or give thanks, ... 26 For this reason God gave them over to degrading passions; ... exchanged the natural function for that which is unnatural."

Understanding the theological significance of homosexuality.

This is an unnatural condition that is a curse on all humanity but not born by all.

Exodus 11:5, 12:29

The firstborn son (if you had one) would die.

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Romans 8

"19 For the anxious longing of the creation waits eagerly for the revealing of the sons of God. 20 For the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will, but because of Him who subjected it, in hope ... 24 For in hope we have been saved, but hope that is seen is not hope; for who hopes for what he already sees? 25 But if we hope for what we do not see, with perseverance we wait eagerly for it."

The divine curse is removed by Christ as a living hope to be realized at his second coming.

"Propitiation"

fully satisfying the just demands of a holy God.

Romans 3

"24 being justified as a gift by His grace through the redemption which is in Christ Jesus; 25 whom God displayed publicly as a **propitiation** in His blood through faith."

"Truly, truly, I say to you, he who hears my word, and believes Him who sent me, has eternal life, and **does not come into judgment**, but has passed out of death into life."

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
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Confusion

- Homosexuality is a sign to the human race, about the human race, (not the unique condemnation of the homosexual).

15

1 Peter 4

"13 but to the degree that you share the sufferings of Christ, keep on **rejoicing**, so that at the **revelation of His glory** you may also rejoice and be overjoyed. 14 If you are insulted for the name of Christ, you are **blessed**, because the Spirit of glory, and of God, rests upon you."

#2 Enhance our union with Christ Even Christ suffered under the curse.

Suffering can unite us with Christ.

1 Peter 1

"6 In this you greatly rejoice, even though now for a little while, if necessary, you have been distressed by **various trials**, 7 that the **proof of your faith**, being more precious than gold which is perishable, even though tested by fire, may be found to result in praise and glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ:"

This is what makes aliens salty.

A Faith, Hope, and Love that is not contingent on this life's blessings or tribulations.

Moses and Paul both chose to share in the suffering with Messiah as well as the blessing that would follow.

Hebrews 11

"24 By faith Moses, when he had grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter; 25 choosing rather to endure ill-treatment with the people of God, than to enjoy the passing pleasures of sin; 26 considering the reproach of Christ (Messiah) greater riches than the treasures of Egypt; for he was looking to the reward."

So what?

- Embrace the "way of the cross" as a part of your calling.
- View your response to suffering as a testimony to your hope that awaited you in the next life.

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1 Peter 4

"15 Make sure that none of you suffers as a murderer, or thief, or evildoer, or a troublesome meddler; 16 but if *anyone suffers* as a Christian, he is not to be **ashamed**, but is to glorify God in this name."

#3 Expose our sins

Not all suffering is honorable.

Suffering can expose & shame us in our sin.

So what?

 Discipline yourself lest your suffering come from your personal sins apart from Adam's.

21

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1 Peter 4

"17 For it is time for judgment to begin with the household of God; and if it begins with us first, what will be the outcome for those who do not **obey the gospel of God?** 18 And if it is with difficulty that the righteous is saved, what will become of the godless man and the sinner? 19 Therefore, those also who **suffer according to the will of God** are to entrust their souls to a faithful Creator in doing what is right."

#4 Exonerate our Gospel hope

Those who obey the Gospel have hope and those who do not, do not.

Suffering can lead to confirming our hope in the Gospel.

So what?

- Find peace in knowing that your suffering is not outside God's will.
- Be thankful for the inexhaustible grace of God in Christ.
- Share the Gospel of hope with those who have no hope beyond this life.



#1 expand our vision. #2 enhance our union. #3 expose our sin. #4 exonerate our hope.



- trials are a test of our faith.
- the way of the cross is suffering.
- there is shame in suffering but only as we bring it on by our sin.
- the Gospel's hope gives us peace and courage.
