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## context

1 Peter 5

"6 Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, so that He may exalt you at the proper time, 7 having cast all your anxiety on Him, because He cares about you."

- Alien anxiety is to be expected as God's chosen people suffer in a broken world.
- Challenge #1 our temporal circumstances.
- Challenge #2 Satan's use of our experience and expectations to tempt us away from the word and way of the Cross.
- Challenge #3 the source of our hope.

Jesus - Matt.4:1-11







False expectations in the face of stressful circumstances and God.

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## Satan tempted Eve by first instilling false expectations.

Genesis 3

"4 serpent said to the woman, "You surely will not die! 5 For God knows that in the day you eat from it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." 6 When the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was desirable to make *one* wise, she took from its fruit and ate; and she gave also to her husband with her, and he ate. 7 Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves loin coverings."

# Satan uses Paul's circumstances to limit Paul's vision and expectations.


#### 2 Corinthians 12

"7 And because of the surpassing greatness of the revelations, for this reason, to keep me from exalting myself, there was given me a thorn in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to buffet me - to keep me from exalting myself! 8 Concerning this I entreated the Lord three times that it might depart from me. 9 And He has said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is perfected in weakness."

## Spiritual Warefare

- Our challenge comes not only from our outer circumstances but even more so with our inner response to them.
- The Gospel is not about changing our physical / social circumstances so much as our inner response to them.
- Spiritual warfare is about our faith relationship with God not our circumstances.

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


#### 1 Peter 5

"8 Be of **sober** *spirit*, be on the **alert**. Your **adversary**, the devil, prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to **devour**. 9 So **resist** him, firm in *your* **faith**, knowing that the same experiences of suffering are being accomplished by your brothers and sisters who are in the world. 10 After you have suffered for a little while, the God of all grace, who called you to His eternal glory in Christ, will Himself **perfect**, **confirm**, **strengthen**, *and* **establish** *you*. 11 To Him *be* dominion forever and ever. Amen."


- Satan is an adversary who attacks us, not with or by suffering, but in our suffering.
- Our hope and resistance is via our faith from within, not rescue from outside.

Job may help us understand the Apostles' teaching.



## The story of JOB

- The test of Job Will he trust God if all the temporal perks are removed and the only thing he has is God.
   Satan's objective is to remove Job's faith not his earthly treasures (1:7)
- Satan removes 1. all material benefits,
   2. physical health, 3. all social support.
- Satan's power controls Job's material world (1:7) but not Job's spiritual responses "do not put forth your hand on him" (1:12).

Job bends but does not break.

God renews Job's perspective.

Job 38

"3 Now gird up your loins like a man, and I will ask you, and you instruct Me! 4 Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell Me, if you have understanding, 5 who set its measurements?"

In the end Job repents.

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Job 42

"5 I have heard of You by the hearing of the ear; but now my eye sees You; 6 therefore I retract, and I repent in dust and ashes."



#### The inner man and the outer man.

2 Corinthians 4

"7 But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the surpassing greatness of the power may be of God and not from ourselves; 8 we are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not despairing; 9 persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; 10 always carrying about in the body the dying of Jesus, that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our body. 11 For we who live are constantly being delivered over to death for Jesus' sake, that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our mortal flesh. 12 So death works in us, but life in you. . . . 16 Therefore we do not lose heart, but though our outer man is decaying, yet our inner man is being renewed day by day. 17 For momentary, light affliction is producing for us an eternal weight of glory far beyond all comparison, 18 while we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen; for the things which are seen are temporal, but the things which are not seen are eternal."

# What does this lesson suggest?

- Spiritual warfare may be less dramatic than we are led to believe.
- Our need may be perseverance and courage through hard times rather than escape from them.
- Deliverance may center on "sit, walk, stand" rather than "cast it out".

Look at the Apostles as examples. Miracles are Signs and go together. 24

#### 1 Peter 5

"12 Through Silvanus, our faithful brother (for so I regard him), I have written to you briefly, exhorting and testifying that **this is the true grace of God.**Stand firm in it! 13 She who is in Babylon, chosen together with you, sends you greetings, and so does my son, Mark. 14 Greet one another with a kiss of love. Peace be to you all who are in Christ."

- Peter's message is the "true grace of God".
- · His exhortation is to "stand firm in it".
- · His closing blessing is "peace to believers".
