

"1 Now in the second year of the reign of Nebuchadnezzar, Nebuchadnezzar had dreams; and **his spirit was troubled and his sleep left him.** 2 Then the king gave orders to call in the magicians, the conjurers, the sorcerers and the Chaldeans to tell the king his dreams. So they came in and stood before the king. 3 The king said to them, "I had a dream and **my spirit is anxious** to understand the dream."

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The Setting

1. The King has a dream that leaves him anxious.
2. He asks his magicians to describe it and interpret it.
3. They are not able to do so.
4. They (along with Daniel) are sentenced to die.

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Daniel is saved

1. Daniel requests time to seek God.
2. Daniel has a vision of the dream.
3. He asks for permission to reveal his vision to the King.
4. Daniel reveals that God has shown him what will take place in the latter days.

"31 "You, O king, were looking and behold, there was a single great statue; that statue, which was large and of extraordinary splendor, was standing in front of you, and its appearance was awesome.

"32 The head of that statue was made of fine gold, its breast and its arms of silver, its belly and its thighs of bronze, 33 its legs of iron, its feet partly of iron and partly of clay. 34 You continued looking until a stone was cut out without hands, and it struck the statue on its feet of iron and clay and crushed them. 35 Then the iron, the clay, the bronze, the silver and the gold were crushed all at the same time and became like chaff from the summer threshing floors; and the wind carried them away so that not a trace of them was found. But the stone that struck the statue became a great mountain and filled the whole earth. 36 "This *was* the dream; now we will tell its interpretation before the king. . . 38 . . . You are the head of gold."

"39 After you there will arise another kingdom inferior to you, then another third kingdom of bronze, which will rule over all the earth. 40 Then there will be a fourth kingdom as strong as iron; inasmuch as iron crushes and shatters all things, so, like iron that breaks in pieces, it will crush and break all these in pieces. 41 In that you saw the feet and toes, partly of potter's clay and partly of iron, it will be a divided kingdom; but it will have in it the toughness of iron, inasmuch as you saw the iron mixed with common clay. 42 As the toes of the feet *were* partly of iron and partly of pottery, *so* some of the kingdom will be strong and part of it will be brittle. 43 And in that you saw the iron mixed with common clay, they will combine with one another in the seed of men; but they will not adhere to one another, even as iron does not combine with pottery."

"44 In the days of those kings the God of heaven will set up a kingdom which will never be destroyed, and *that* kingdom will not be left for another people; it will crush and put an end to all these kingdoms, but it will itself endure forever."

There is no clear record that the virgin birth of Jesus was predicted in Isaiah (from a grammatical-historical perspective).


It was only made clear through Matthew’s Gospel.

**Possible interpretations**

- False prophecy** -  
unfulfilled at Christ’s coming.
- Fulfilled at Christ’s 1st coming** -  
the church is crushing the world’s powers.
- Fulfilled at Christ’s 2nd coming** -  
Christ will physically come and rule.
- Combines 1st & 2nd coming** -  
Christ initiates the kingdom spiritually but does not fulfill it until the end of history.

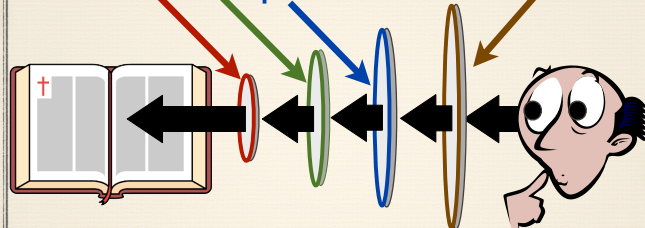

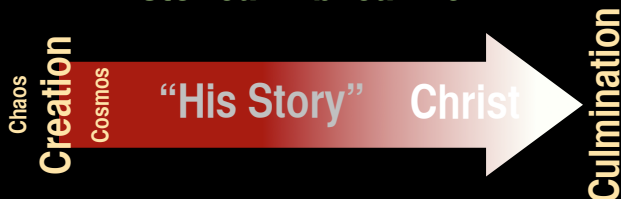

### *Historical Biblical view*



- History has an end & purpose.
- God in some real sense has His hand on history.
- Christ is the focus of the historical narrative.
- Human governments will fail.
- God's people will, after all, be blessed.

### *Implications*

- ✓ Christians have hope in spite of temporal circumstances.
- ✓ Christians trust that all things will ultimately work together for the good because God will ultimately prevail.



## *Lessons*

## *Implications*

- ✓ Christians are not hopeful about, or heavily invested in, political solutions.
- ✓ Christians are committed to responsible citizenship but prepared for disappointment.

## *What do we know?*

**History is moving to a culmination** - It has a beginning and an end. It has meaning.

**All human governments will fail** - They are temporal and disappointing.

**In the end God's kingdom will stand** - It will not pass away.

**We are alien ambassadors until Christ comes** - We are to abide as faithful stewards until.

## *What do we not know?*

**When and how this will take place.**

We have hints but cannot be sure of time and means.

We are closer now than anyone has ever been.

We are not asked to know the details or time of the culmination - just to be faithful.

1. The King is impressed with Daniel's God.
2. He gives Daniel governing power in Babylon.
3. He also promotes Daniel's friends.
4. The challenge now is to see how Godly character handles prosperity and power.
