The Point of this lesson:

Ephesians 1

"11 also we have obtained an **inheritance**, having been predestined according to His purpose who works all things after the counsel of His will, 12 to the end that we who were the first to hope in Christ should be to the praise of His glory. 13 In Him, you also, after listening to the message of truth, the gospel of your salvation — having also believed, you were **sealed** in Him with the Holy Spirit of **promise**, 14 who is given as a **pledge** of our inheritance, with a view to the redemption of God's own possession, to the praise of His glory."

1 Peter 1:4

"to obtain an **inheritance** which is imperishable and undefiled and will not fade away, **reserved in heaven** for you."

Hebrews 9:15

"Therefore he is the mediator of a new covenant, so that those who are called may receive the **promised eternal inheritance**,"

Romans 8:17

"and if children, heirs also, heirs of God and **fellow** heirs with Christ,"

Colossians 1:12

"giving thanks to the Father, who has qualified us to share in **the inheritance of the saints** in Light."

Inheritance = heaven

Colossians 1

"25 . . . that I might fully carry out the preaching of the word of God, 26 that is, the mystery which has been hidden from the past ages and generations; but has now been manifested to His saints, 27 to whom God willed to make known what is the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory."

The mystery that was made known to the world through the Gospel was the "indwelling Christ" "the hope of glory" for both Jew and Gentile.

- The law of God engraved in our heart.



"1 Therefore, since we have so great a cloud of witnesses surrounding us, let us also lay aside every encumbrance, and the sin which so easily entangles us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, ² fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. ³ For consider Him who has endured such hostility by sinners against Himself, so that you may not grow weary and lose heart."
