was a Calvinist who began to question some of its teachings.


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


TULIP (High Reformed Theology)


- Total depravity we are incapable of responding to Christ without first being regenerated.
- U nconditional election God chose individuals for salvation based on His sovereign will alone.
- Limited atonement Christ's death effected the redemption of the elect only.
- rresistible grace All whom God calls cannot but respond with faith and obedience.
- Preservation of the saints All whom God calls will not fail to display faith and good works until the end.
















Even evil seems to be ordained of God.


Isaiah 45:7

Some form of human free will must be respected for several reasons.

- The "image of God" in all humans involves the ability to respond to God.
- Free volition is assumed in much of the Biblical narratives and teachings.
- Ethics, just judgment, warnings, rewards, love, etc. are meaningless without human freedom.
- Free volition is necessary to preserve human responsibility for sin and evil.
- Free volition is necessary to preserve God's integrity as consistently holy, just, and loving.

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2. Human moral responsibility (freedom) is also well attested in Scripture.

John3:16

""For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, **that whoever believes** in Him should not perish, but have eternal life."

1 Timothy 2:6

"who gave Himself a ransom for all,"

2 Peter 3:9

"The Lord is ... not wishing for any to perish but for all to come to repentance."

3. Divine foreknowledge is mentioned in Scripture.

Romans 8:29

"For whom He **foreknew**, He also predestined to become conformed to the image of His Son, that He might be the first-born among many brethren;"

1 Peter 1

"1 To those who reside as aliens, scattered throughout Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia, who are chosen 2 according to the **foreknowledge** of God the Father, by the sanctifying work of the Spirit, to obey Jesus Christ and be sprinkled with His blood:"

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Two concepts

- 1. Foreordination (predestination) God's decree before creation as to what would and would not happen.
- 2. Foreknowledge God's sense of what would happen (through free choice) before it occurred.

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Three understandings of the relationship between God's foreknowledge and His foreordination.

- 1. Foreordination precedes Foreknowledge. (John Calvin)
- 2. Foreknowledge precedes Foreordination. (John Wesley)
- 3. Foreknowledge and Foreordination are inseparable as a part of God's creation of the ages. (a mystery to temporal thought)

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4. God's creative work included both the universe (cosmos) and history (aion)

Hebrews 1:2

"in these last days (God) has spoken to us in His Son, whom He appointed heir of all things, through whom also **He made the world (aion)**."

Hebrews 11:3

"By faith we understand that the worlds (aion) were prepared by the word of God,"

Ephesians 2:2, 3:21

"you formerly walked according to the course (aion) of this world (cosmos)."

"to all generations forever (aion) and ever (aion)."

5. On this issue we have limited access to wisdom.

Deuteronomy 29:29

"The secret things belong to the Lord our God, but the things revealed belong to us and to our sons forever, that we may observe all the words of this law."

1 Corinthians 13:12

"For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face; now **I know in part**, but then I will know fully just as I also have been fully known."

Hebrews 11:3

"By faith we understand that the worlds (aion) were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was not made out of things which are visible."

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We will ask the question but cannot demand a full explanation.

Romans 9

"16 So then it does not depend on the man who wills or the man who runs, but on God who has mercy. 17 For the Scripture says to Pharaoh, "For this very purpose I raised you up, to demonstrate My power in you, and that My name might be proclaimed throughout the whole earth." 18 So then He has mercy on whom He desires, and He hardens whom He desires. 19 You will say to me then, "Why does He still find fault? For who resists His will?" 20 On the contrary, who are you, O man, who answers back to God? The thing molded will not say to the molder, "Why did you make me like this," will it? 21 Or does not the potter have a right over the clay, to make from the same lump one vessel for honorable use, and another for common use?"


How does God work all things together for his purposes?


Predestination

Ephesians 1

"11 also we have obtained an inheritance, having been predestined according to His purpose who works all things after the counsel of His will, 12 to the end that we who were the first to hope in Christ should be to the praise of His glory."

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Romans 8:28

"And we know that **in all things God works for good** to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose."

Examples

- Paul's thorn in the flesh (2 Cor. 12:1-10) It was from Satan but God used it for good.
- Our suffering in this life (2 Cor. 1:1-11) It enables us to comfort others who suffer.
- The Cross of Christ It was unjust but God used it for good.
- Joseph's captivity (Gen. 50:20) It was evil but God used it for good.
- What is painful for you right NOW It is a door to develop or demonstrate the image of Christ. 26


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

Genesis I

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
"Calvinism emphasizes divine sovereignty and free grace; Arminianism emphasizes human responsibility. The one restricts the saving grace to the elect: the other extends it to all men on the condition of faith. Both are right in what they assert; both are wrong in what they deny. If one important truth is pressed to the exclusion of another truth of equal importance, it becomes an error, and loses its hold upon the conscience. The Bible gives us a theology which is more human than Calvinism, and more divine than Arminianism, and more Christian than either of them."
