
A key observation

Ephesians 2


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The Christian Gospel is about What God has What we must DONE not DO! It is God's GOOD NEWS not His "doubling down" on our keeping the Law.



Don't confuse the ministries

Don't confuse the ministries of the Law, the Son, and the Spirit.



A key observation

The emphasis is on what God has done not on what we must do.

- We are saved "by faith" for "good works", but there are no exhortations to either in this passage.
- Exhortations will come later and in a different context but Paul wants us first to understand:

Is faith a gift of God?

Ephesians 2:8

"For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God;"

Neuter

Feminine

"Grace is God's part, faith ours."
"That" refers to the act of being saved by grace conditioned on our faith."

John Calvin (unlike many of his followers) did not use this text to support his view that faith was a gift from God.

Is faith a gift of God?

Ephesians 2:8

"For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not f yourselves, it is the gift of God;"

Paraphrase

"Salvation by grace (which is received by faith) is a gift of God. This system of salvation, based on God's imputed righteousness through Christ (not our meritorious works), means that we have nothing to boast about.

Saved by faith - Judged by works

- · Both are clearly taught in the N.T.
- Some believe that true faith will produce the righteousness demanded by God at the final judgment.
 - How much and for how long?
 - · Are we selling God's holiness short?



 Others believe that Christians are judged not for salvation but for rewards in heaven by their works.

1 Corinthians 3

1 Corinthians 3

"10 According to the grace of God which was given to me, like a wise master builder I laid a foundation, and another is building on it. But each man must be careful how he builds on it. 11 For no man can lay a foundation other than the one which is laid, which is Jesus Christ. 12 Now if any man **builds upon the foundation** with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw, 13 each man's work will become evident; for the day will show it, because it is to be revealed with fire; and the fire itself will test the quality of each man's work. 14 If any man's work which he has built upon it remains, he shall **receive a reward**. 15 If any man's work is burned up, he shall **suffer loss**; but **he himself shall be saved**, yet so as through fire"

How Christians build on their faith in Christ is the issue.

Is this judgment for reward and loss (not salvation) the result of the believer's works?

The Means of the Gospel "in Christ" "though faith" Clarification

- Christ is the covenant blessing promised to Abraham.
- All who are united with Christ (in Christ) share the promised blessings.
- · Faith is the way we are united with Christ.

Faith is not a "meritorious work" as Paul reminds us in Rom.3:28.

The Lesson

The Christian Gospel is a reflection of God's love and grace to all who believe.

Christians are called to show to the world God's love in the way they live.
