
Ephesians 2

"11 Therefore **remember**, that formerly you, the Gentiles in the flesh, who are called "Uncircumcision" by the so-called "Circumcision," which is performed in the flesh by human hands – 12 **remember** that you were at that time separate from Christ, excluded (**alienated**) from the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world."

The Promise through Abram

Genesis 12

"2 and I will make you (**Abram**) a great nation, and I will bless, you, and make your name great; and so you shall be a blessing; 3 and I will bless those who bless you, and the one who curses you I will curse, and in you all families of the earth will be blessed."

"In your seed all the nations of the earth shall be blessed,"




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
Galatians 3


In what sense did Christ abolish the Law?

"15 by abolishing in His flesh the enmity, which is the Law of commandments contained in ordinances,"

- The ceremonial aspects of the Law were fulfilled in Christ's death.
- The covenant demands of the Law were fulfilled in Christ's righteousness imputed to believers.

The constraining aspects of the Law remain as a reminder of God's nature.


Ephesians 2



The nature of Christ's church

- It is a spiritual community (not ethnically defined or restricted) that transcends worldly culture by creating a new culture or society.
- It is a community of reconciliation, uniting (not dividing) people of different races.
- It is in process and not yet fully formed.
- Jesus' death and resurrection not tradition, the Old Covenant, or subjective experiences constitute its cornerstone.
- The Apostles' teaching not cultural distinctive define its boundaries.





So what?


