Not uniformity but synergism



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Ephesians 4

- "1 I, **therefore**, the prisoner of the Lord, entreat you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling with which you have been called."
- "Therefore" points us back to ch.1-3. There is a rational for Christian conduct.

Ephesians 4

- "1 I, **therefore**, the prisoner of the Lord, entreat you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling with which you have been called,"
- "Therefore" points us back to ch.1-3. There is a rational for Christian conduct.
- · It is NOT:
 - 1. What is popular or expedient
 - 2. What will gain God's love or acceptances

BUT BECAUSE of what God has done for us.

The way we live is a function of what God has done for us in Christ.

Ephesians 4

- "1 I, therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, **entreat** you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling with which you have been called,"
- The Greek word translated "entreat" means to "come alongside".
- Paul steps down from his pulpit, gets off his knees, (ch.1-3) and says "Now here are the implications of what I am teaching and for what I am praying."

Insight will instruct our lives, especially our relationships.

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Ephesians 4

- "1 I, therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, entreat you to walk in a manner worthy of the **calling** with which you have been called,"
- The Christian life starts NOT WITH US but with:
 - 1. God's work in Christ
 - 2. Our insight concerning this work
 - 3. Our new identity "in Christ"

The way we live is a function of who we see ourselves to be.

Ephesians 4

"2 with all humility and gentleness, with patience, showing forbearance to one another in love, 3 being diligent to preserve the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace."

- Vs.2-16 address Christian UNITY.
- This is perhaps more important to God than it is to many in His household.
- · Household rules for the Body of Christ.
 - ✓ Humility.
 - ✓ Gentleness with patience & forbearance.
 - ✓ Diligence in preserving peace.

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Ephesians 4

"2 with all humility"

 "Humility" (lowly minded) is a term that was not a virtue in the ancient world. It was to describe the lower slave class.

Colossians 3

"12 And so, as those who have been chosen of God, holy and beloved, put on a heart of **compassion**, **kindness**, **humility**, **gentleness** and **patience**; 13 **bearing** with one another, and **forgiving** each other, whoever has a complaint against anyone; just as the Lord forgave you, so also should you. 14 And beyond all these things put on **love**, which is the perfect bond of **unity**. 15 And let the **peace** of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body; and be thankful."

Romans 12

- "1 I urge you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual (rational) service of worship."
 - "Present" is an act of volition and faith which is viewed as "reasonable" but contrary to "this world's" instincts.

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Self-preservation is a basic law of nature; self-sacrifice is a basic call of every Christian.

Philippians 2

Our walk starts with the way we view

"3 Do nothing from selfishness or empty conceit, but with humility of mind let each of you regard one another as more important than himself; 4 do not merely look out for your own personal interests, but also for the interests of others. 5 Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus, 6 who, although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, 7 but emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men. 8 And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross."

 and extends to the degree of self sacrifice we are willing to make.

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
Ephesians 4

- "... and gentleness, with patience (long suffering), showing forbearance to one another in love,
 - These words tell us what "humility" should look like.
 - ✓ It should be gentle, not contentious or demanding.
 - ✓ It should be willing to patiently wait especially when it involves self sacrifice.
 - ✓ It should forebear with things that at times may seem to us immature, foolish, and meaningless.

Ephesians 4

- "3 being **diligent to preserve the unity** of the Spirit in the bond of peace."
- The "unity" that is to be preserved is "of the Spirit" not political, economic, racial, class, educational, or developmental.
 - ✓ It requires "diligence" because it will be counter intuitive to the world.
 - ✓ It is to be "preserved" because it is the normal Christian life when the Spirit is in control.
- The "unity" is not uniformity but rather like the different parts of one body.

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Yes but!

 Are there not times when we must separate from ideas, doctrines, and practices that are not Godly? YES!

but only after we have committed ourselves to the importance of unity.

"with **patience**, showing **forbearance** to one another in **love**."

- √ Too many of us have little patience.
- √ Too many of us forebear with too little.
- √ Too many of us love our style, and preference more than unity.

Test your Patience, Forbearance, Love index

- Do you define your preferences as "God's will for the church" or do you see unity as involving patience and forbearance?
- Do you view taste differences as a hindrance to your worship, growth, & enthusiasm for the church or an opportunity to learn from and serve the preferences of others?
- Are you looking to grow within your comfort zone or expecting to grow through being stretched?
- Are you feeling disrespected & ignored or are you disrespecting and ignoring others?
