
This raises many questions.


- 1. On issues of style, taste, that are not sin How am I to relate with brothers and sisters who do not see things the way I do?
- 2. On public policy in a secular state Over what issues should I take a political stand?
- 3. On issues of sinning believers When and how am I to confront and correct others?

This raises three questions.

- On issues of style, taste, that are not sin-Understand and follow some basic "Body life" principles. (see the rest of Eph. and 1 Cor.12-14).
- On public policy in a secular state -Don't confuse church and state.

- 3. On issues of sinning believers When and how am I to confront and correct others?







Galatians 6:2

3. Learn from Paul's example.

- √ Some sins are not to be tolerated and may call for social separation.
- 2 Jn.9-11 Going beyond Christ adding to, so as to discount the Gospel.
- 1 Tim.1:19-20 Blasphemy open disrespect for things holy (shipwrecked faith).
- 1 Cor.5:1-13 Open moral autonomy sexual immorality.
- 2 Thess.3:6,11,14-15 Freeloading refusing to work and living off others.
- Gal.1:8-9 Preaching another gospel denying the grace of God in Christ.
- Rom.16:17-18, Titus 3:9-11 Troublemaking sowing discord among the brethren.

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Matters requiring public church discipline share common characteristics.

- √ They are OPEN issues (public) issues that affect many.
 - √ They are HEART issues (spiritual rebellion) issues.
 - √ They are DESTRUCTIVE issues (damaging) the whole church.
 - √ They are PERSISTENT issues (remain) unrepentant.

Who? those who are spiritual adults (mature).
What? bringing back - a process which needs time

"1 Brethren, even if a man is caught (overtaken) in any trespass, you (plural) who are **spiritual**, restore (bring back) such a one . . ."

- 1. Not everyone is **responsible** to address the sins of others.
 - √ This is best left to spiritual shepherds.
 - √ If you are not a part of the problem or the solution back off.
 - √ Gossip and Slander just make things harder.
 - √ It takes more than the gift of discerning sin to restore a sinner.

3. Learn from Paul's example.

- √ Most of Paul's correction is in the form of instruction how to live in community. (Eph.4-6)
- **✓** Many sins call for correction with forbearance.
 - secondary doctrine like prophecy,
 - pride & selfish behavior,
 - marginalization of gifts,
 - lawsuits.
 - divorce,
 - eating food offered to idols,
 - misuse of spiritual gifts
- **✓** Galatians 6:1-5 is an example of Paul's advice.

Qualifications for a correcting ministry

- 1. Experience Understanding the dynamics of the spiritual life.
- 2. Relationship A trusted connection with the one being corrected.
- 3. Listening Sensitivity to address the roots of personal failure.
- 4. Wisdom Knowing how to wisely confront, correct, and restore.

Some that help us understand others

- Goals What are you trying to achieve?
 We want to help you identify and reach basic longings in God's way and without fear.
- Fears What are you trying to avoid? We want to help you take the risk of trusting God and facing down your fears.
- Narrative Tell me your story? We want to understand how you got to this place in life.
- Consequences Do you understand the consequences of your convictions / conduct?

Note the way Jesus addressed sinners.

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- "1 Brethren, even if a man is caught (overtaken) in any trespass, you (plural) who are **spiritual**, restore (bring back) such a one . . ."
- 1. Not everyone is **responsible** to address the sins of others.
- 2. The call is to restore not condemn.
 - √ Move toward don't withdraw from.
 - √ Unprotected dignity makes restoration very difficult.
 - √ Public exposure is wise ONLY as a last resort.
 - √ Bring back the fallen don't cast out or shut out.
 - √ Repentance should bring an end to chastisement.


Galatians 6

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"1 Brethren, even if a man is caught (overtaken) in any trespass, you (plural) who are **spiritual**, restore (bring back) such a one . . ."

How? gentleness, humility, shared responsibility in a spirit of gentleness; each one looking to yourself, lest you too be tempted. ² Bear one another's burdens, and thus fulfill the law of Christ. ³ For if anyone thinks he is something when he is nothing, he deceives himself. ⁴ But let each one examine his own work, and then he will have reason for boasting in regard to himself alone, and not in regard to another. ⁵ For each one shall bear his own load."





People with Godly character.

- 1. They understand and respect the continuum of what is celebrated and condemned.
- 2. They expect personal sacrifice in bearing one another's burdens.
- 3. They learn from Paul's example.
 - Confrontation is for the wise and mature.
 - · Restoration is the goal.
 - Humility, patience, and gentleness are needed.
- 4. They address the roots of sin as well as the fruits of sin.
