

Ephesians 6

"⁵ Slaves, be obedient to those who are your masters according to the flesh, with fear and trembling, in the sincerity of your heart, as to Christ; . . ."

"9 And, masters, do the same things to them, and give up threatening, knowing that both their Master and yours is in heaven, and there is no partiality with Him."

This teaching raises lots of questions

Thus far we have

- seen this teaching as part of a broader theme.
 "Be subject one to another."
- shown how it is consistent with the broader teaching of the Gospel.
 - The Word of the Cross suffering in this life
 - The Kingdom of God will not be realized now
 - The Bondage to Christ effects all believers
 - The Freedom in Spirit not in circumstances

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We now need to address

 How are we to respond to social injustice systemic evil like racial discrimination, economic injustice, etc.

Social injustice in the Bible

- The Bible gives more attention to social justice teaching than to - heaven & hell, world evangelism, & prophecy combined.
- Almost all of the teaching on social justice is centered on relationships within the community of faith (Israel and church).
- When the N.T. addresses the believer's responsibility to social issues outside the faith community its emphasis is on suffering & submission rather than reform.

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Two things that opened the door for the Gospel in the early church:


Individual Christian's Response:

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to personal suffering.
to the needs of others.

The current generation of young Christians are not nearly as interested in what the previous generation believed as in how their faith is expressed in what they do.

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1. Do good to all men.

Galatians 6

"9 Let us not lose heart in doing good, for **in due time** we will reap if we do not grow weary. 10 So then, while we have opportunity (**time**), let us do good **to all men**, and especially to those who are of the household of the faith."

Starting within the church we should "do good" to all people.

Love demands that we show the image of God by respecting all who bear that image.



He did not answer me but instead bent down, picked up another starfish, and cast it back into the water. Then he smiled, looked me in the eye, and said, "It made a difference to that one!"



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



Matthew 22:21 "Jesus said "**Render to Caesar** the things that are **Caesar's**; and to God the things that are God's.""


In the USA Caesar = "we the people"

"A government of, for and by the people"

"Rendering to Caesar" = individuals taking responsibility for social policy







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Isaiah 10

"1 Woe to those who make **unjust laws**, to those who issue **oppressive decrees**, 2 to **deprive the poor of their rights and withhold justice from the oppressed** of my people, making widows their prey and robbing the fatherless."

Prejudice + Power = Irrational Discrimination

3. Affirmative action

an action or policy **favoring** those who tend to suffer from negative discrimination (especially in relation to employment or education) is called **positive or reverse discrimination**.

The great commandment

- the worship of God through favoring those who bear God's image and yet are marginalized in the world's eyes -

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3. Affirmative action Example A wise teacher should not give a poor student a high grade that they don't deserve but rather give that student extra attention so that their high grade

is earned.

Biblical example #1 1 Corinthians 12

"21 And the eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you"; or again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you." 22 On the contrary, it is much truer that the members of the body which seem to be weaker are necessary; 23 and **those members of the body, which** we deem less honorable, on these we bestow more abundant honor, and our unseemly members come to have more abundant seemliness, 24 whereas our seemly members have no need of it. But God has so composed the body, giving more abundant honor to that member which lacked, 25 that there should be no division in the body, but that the members should have the same care for one another. 26 And if one member suffers, all the members suffer with it; if one member is honored, all the members rejoice with it."

Biblical example #2 Acts 6

"1 ... a complaint arose on the part of the Hellenistic Jews against the native Hebrews, because their widows were being overlooked in the daily serving of food. ² And the twelve summoned the congregation of the disciples and said, ... ³ select from among you, brethren, seven men of good reputation, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we may put in charge of this task. ... ⁵ ... and they chose **Stephen**, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit, and **Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas and Nicolas,** a proselyte from Antioch."

- Comfort the wounded.
