



The Judgment of God


- 1. The holiness of God is the basis on which the whole Biblical story rests.

 I am a victim - Mistakes were made but not by me.


Doubt


- · The believer's defense against Satan rests on:

 - 3) and a freedom from the fear of death.


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

















"Me" centered religion makes us vulnerable to:


As Christians we are holy in two senses:


