

It is hard to know which Greek term is used in any N.T. text, (even by looking at the context).

Acts 10:44

"While Peter was still speaking these **words** (**R**), the Holy Spirit fell upon all those who were listening to the **message** (**L**)."

Hebrews 12:18-19

"you have not come to . . . the blast of a trumpet and the sound of **words (R)** which sound was such that those who heard begged that no further **word (L)** should be spoken to them."



Hebrews 4:12

"For the **word** (L) of God is living and active and sharper than any two-edged sword, and piercing as far as the division of soul and spirit, of both joints and marrow, and able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart."

John 6:63

"It is the Spirit who gives life; the flesh profits nothing; the **words (R)** that I have spoken, to you are spirit and are life."



1 Peter 1

"23 for you have been born again not of seed which is perishable but imperishable, *that is*, through the living and enduring **word (L)** of God. 24 For, "All flesh is like grass. The grass withers, and the flower falls off. 25 But the **word (R)** of the Lord endures forever. And this is the **word (R)** which was preached to you."

- The terms are used interchangeably in the Greek translation of the O.T.
- We should not give these terms a rigid technical meaning.

Different emphasis bring different challenges.

Rhema (Logos spoken and heard)

Form emphasis:

"There is power

in just saying the right words."

"High Church" Protestant & Charismatic Christ (Logos incarnate and relational)

Subjective emphasis:

"Relationship without "truth propositions.""

Neo-orthodox Main line Protestant Graphe (Logos written and read)

Propositional emphasis:

"Bibliolatry"

Fundamentalist & Evangelical Protestant

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What can we say about "Rhema"

- It is the speaking of God's Spirit and the hearing of our spirit.
- It is the basis of the Scripture in that the human authors wrote what God's Spirit had revealed to them.
- It is ultimately a call to the truth of the kingdom of God.
- Jesus quoted from the Scripture in his confrontation with Satan.

The Word of God is inspired but its use is fruitful, only when rightly understood and applied.

1 Timothy 1

"6 For some men, straying from these things, have turned aside to fruitless discussion, 7 wanting to be teachers of the Law, even though they do not understand either what they are saying or the matters about which they make confident assertions.

But we know that the Law is good, if one uses it lawfully,"

2 Timothy 2:15

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"15 Be diligent to present yourself approved to God as a workman who does not need to be ashamed, **handling accurately the word of truth**."

Correct understanding calls for "diligence" (work or study) not superficial or casual impressions.

A person can believe the Bible is inspired, inherent, and authoritative yet be Satan's scribe in using it.

apart from Scripture."






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Matthew 4

"1 Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. 2 And after He had fasted forty days and forty nights, He then became hungry. 3 And the tempter came and said to Him, "If You are the Son of God, command that these stones become bread. 4 But He answered and said, "It is written, 'Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word (R) that proceeds out of the mouth of God."





"5 Then the devil took Him into the holy city; and he had Him stand on the pinnacle of the temple, 6 and said to Him, "If You are the Son of God throw Yourself down for it is written, 'He will give His angels charge concerning You;' and 'On their hands they will bear You up, Lest You strike Your foot against a stone. 7 Jesus said to him, "On the other hand, it is written, 'You shall not put the Lord your God to the test." Note Jesus' responses:

John 21:18

"Truly, truly, I say to you (**Peter**), when you were younger, you used to gird yourself, and walk wherever you wished; but when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will gird you, and **bring you where you do not wish to go**." 21

"8 Again, the devil took Him to a very high mountain, and showed Him all the kingdoms of the world, and their glory; 9 and he said to Him, "All these things will I give You, if You fall down and worship me. 10 Then Jesus said to him, "Begone, Satan! For it is written, 'You shall worship the Lord your God, and serve Him only,' 11 Then the devil left Him; and behold, angels came and began to minister to Him."

John 14:6

"I am **the way**, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father, but through Me."

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Some wayward means:

- Superficial power (political, social, economic, etc.).
- Superficial holiness (looking good outwardly only).
- Superficial values (favoring the rich, famous, and powerful of the world).
- Superficial goals (temporal comfort, happiness, position, and success).



Note Jesus' responses: Life needs more than a material reservoir for shalom. Life is about our serving God not God serving us. Life is not just about the ends but also the means to those ends.

 Jesus based this on Biblical revelation not church authority or private knowledge.

Basic rules of wise use of the Word of God

- Become familiar with the Bible.
- Listen to the insights of those who are credible teachers.
- · Keep the main thing the main thing.
- Maintain a sound mind, a pure heart, a disciplined walk and godly company.
