


In prayer we give critical attention to:

1 John 5



• Paul begins the letter with his prayer for the Ephesians and
ends his letter exhorting them to pray for one another and him.
Paul encourages prayer that is sensitive to the Spirit, the
situation, and the saints.Paul prays for his freedom (not
Paul prays for his freedom (not from his chains) but to be a bold ambassador for the Gospel. (and that he might be with them - Philemon 22)

Note what is not on Paul's prayer list

- Hopes that are centered in this life.
- Agendas that are "self centered".
- Escape from physical suffering.
- Escape from spiritual struggle.

How to pray for others when you don't know what to "petition God for".

- That they would see the inheritance, hope, and power they have in Christ.
- That they would know and display God's love for His family.
- That they would persevere through the trials of life.

 That they would be a faithful ambassador for Christ.
