




How does America measure success?



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A socialist society

A capitalist

A Christian society

views liberty and productivity as responsibilities more than a rights - and competition as inseparable from compassion, and cooperation.

Christians can "do good" in both capitalist and socialist societies.

1 Timothy 6

"1 Let all who are **under the yoke as slaves** regard their own masters as worthy of all honor so that the name of God and our doctrine may not be spoken against. 2 And let those who have believers as their masters not be disrespectful to them because they are brethren, but let them serve them all the more, because those who partake of the benefit are believers and beloved. Teach and preach these principles.3 If anyone advocates a different doctrine, and does not agree with sound words, those of our Lord Jesus Christ, and with the doctrine conforming to godliness, 4 he is conceited and **understands nothing**; but he has a morbid interest in controversial questions and disputes about words, out of which arise envy, strife, abusive language, evil suspicions,"

The Way of the Cross is the Christian's I.D. 1 Corinthians 1

"23 but we preach **Christ crucified**, to Jews a stumbling block, and to Gentiles foolishness, 24 but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God....

²⁶ For consider your calling, brothers *and sisters*, that there were not many wise according to the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble; ²⁷ but **God has chosen the foolish things of the world to shame the wise, and God has chosen the weak things of the world to shame the things which are strong**, ²⁸ and the insignificant things of the world and the despised God has chosen, the things that are not, so that He may nullify the things that are, ²⁹ so that no human may boast before God." **22**



The Christian "have lots" are not to define themselves by their worldly circumstances.

The Bible has more to say about the dangers of material wealth to those who have it than the value it might be to those who do not have it.


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Four important truths about "the Way of the Cross"

- ✓ There is a danger that both the "have nots" and the "have lots" will focus on the sins of the other and neglect their role as a witness to the kingdom.
- ✓ Social ethics (justice for the "have nots") is a responsibility of the "have lots". We will see this in subsequent chapters in James.
- ✓ Social ethics start with applying the Way of the Cross to our lives, whether rich or poor.

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 \checkmark Social ethics are a sign not a solution.
