We live in a world with two conflicted "world and life views"

The world seems to demand that every ethical principle is deemed relevant only when reduced to political action. The Word and Way of the Cross addresses the human dilemma personally before it can be applied politically.

This is critical to a proper understanding of the Gospel.

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John 16:33 "These things I have spoken to you, that **in Me** you may have peace. In the world you have tribulation, but take courage; I have overcome the world."

The Way of the Cross - spiritual / personal (inward)


4. The Way of the Cross may seem foolish in the world's eyes.

The way of the World - sees the Way of the Cross as foolishness The Way of the Cross - is wisdom and power for true change

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

5. Expectations within the faith community differ from those outside it.

1 Corinthians 5

"9 I wrote you in my letter not to associate with immoral people; 10 I did not at all mean with the immoral people of this world,... 11 But actually, I wrote to you not to associate with any so-called brother if he should be an immoral person,... 12 For what have I to do with judging **outsiders?** Do you not judge those who are within the church? 13 But those who are outside, God judges."

The way of the World - calls for tolerance with and witness to a superficial hope. The Way of the Cross - calls for a higher standard within the church. 14

6. Social reform by the church in the state is a sign, not a solution to injustice.



(Consider "Caesar, Nero") Both Peter & James were martyred.

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
Evangelicals are "one election away from losing everything."

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




Hate is not the first enemy of love, FEAR is. It destroys our ability to trust.







When we love all fear disappears,


& when we are afraid all love disappears.

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
Anxiety (fear) is a dis-ease of soul that comes when the pressure of a fallen world meets the **posture of an insecure life**.

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Don't let a broken world determine our values (2:1-13).

- 1. Address the root issues between us and God not us and them (vs.1-4)
- 2. Trust the Way of the Cross What would Jesus do give dignity to the "have nots".
- 3. Social justice starts in the church We give the world a sign of a coming Kingdom.
- 4. Have realistic expectations We do not expect the Kingdom before its time and without its King.

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
