

1 Peter 4






1. See suffering / death as Visual Aids.

Dawkins' natural mind would do well to listen to his (natural) heart.



Ephesians 1

Follow Jesus, who faced the Cross knowing what was behind it and beyond it.

Ephesians 3

"14 For this reason, I bow my knees before the Father, 15 from whom every family in heaven and on earth derives its name, 16 that He would grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened with power through His Spirit in the inner man; 17 so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith; and that you, being rooted and grounded in love, 18 may be able to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, 19 and to know the love of Christ which surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled up to all the fullness of God."

Follow Jesus, who prayed that his followers would know (and show) the love of God as he did.

Philippians 4 (from Paul while in prison)

"4 Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice! 5 Let your forbearing spirit be known to all men. The Lord is near. 6 Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with **thanksgiving** let your requests be made known to God. 7 And the **peace** of God, which surpasses all comprehension, shall guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

Joy, forbearance, and thankfulness (under difficult circumstances) are heart and mind issues that the world will not understand.
