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## 2. Is God fair?

(the challenge of pluralism)

Does a person have to believe in Jesus as their personal savior in order to go to heaven?

Is it fair and consistent with a God of love to exclude those who do not respond to him in a prescribed way?

#### Matthew 13

"47 Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a dragnet cast into the sea, and **gathering fish of every kind**; 48 and when it was filled, they drew it up on the beach; and they sat down, and gathered the **good fish** into containers, but the **bad** they threw away.

49 So it will be at the **end of the age**; the angels shall come forth, and **take out the wicked from among the righteous**, 50 and will cast them into the furnace of fire; there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth."

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# **Background Context**

✓ Jewish Law identifies some fish to be "unclean".

Leviticus 11:12 "Whatever in the water does not have fins and scales is abhorrent to you."

- ✓ Dragnet fishing catches both clean and unclean fish.
- √ The fish are separated in the end after the fishing is over.

# In what sense is the Kingdom like a dragnet?

- ✓ One of the functions of the kingdom is to gather and judge all people.
- √ Both the gathering and the judging will take place at the end of time.

# **The POINT**



At the end of time every person will give a moral accounting to God.

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### 1. No one can escape the final judgment.

Acts 17

"30 Therefore having overlooked the times of ignorance, God is now declaring to men that all everywhere should repent, 31 because **He has fixed a day in which He will judge the world in righteousness through a Man whom He has appointed, having furnished proof to all men by raising Him from the dead."** 

### 2. This court should intimidate everyone.

Romans 3

"9 we have already charged that both Jews and Greeks are all under sin; 10 as it is written, "There is none righteous, not even one;"

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# How have Christians reconciled two seemingly contradictory messages?


Saved through faith apart from works




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# Three possible sources of hope at the final judgment:

- 1. Dismissal Remove the standard of holiness so that there is no offense.
  - · A loving God would never condemn anyone.
- 2. Empowerment Enable believers to meet the standard by the power of the Holy Spirit.
  - •The Holy Spirit empowers true believers to fulfill the Law.



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# Can our security rest in what Christ does THROUGH us?

# **Justification before God** is not by the Spirit but by the Cross. Surrogate **Paraclete** (Substitute)



"To the church of God which is at Corinth, to those who have been sanctified in Christ Jesus, saints by calling,"


### Our Practice in this life as disciples


1 Corinthians 3:3

"for you are still **fleshly**. For since there is jealousy and strife among you, are you not fleshly, and are you not walking like mere men?"



"He made Him who knew no sin **to** be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him."





# Our salvation rests with our positional holiness not our practiced holiness

1. Positional holiness in the Old Testament



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The temple priest was ceremonially sanctified with water before he performed his sacred duties.

This had to do with his official position not his personal character.

Water baptism is our "positional" washing as believer priests.

This has to do with our union with Christ not our meritorious good works.



Revelation 20

John's version of the Final Judgement

"11 And I saw a great white throne, . . . 12 And I saw the dead, small and great, stand before God; and the books were opened: and another book was opened, which is the book of life: and the dead were judged out of those things which were written in the books, according to their works. 13 And the sea gave up the dead, which were in it; and death and Hades delivered up the dead, which were in them: and they were judged every man according to their works. 14 And death and hell were cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death. 15 And whosoever was not found written in the book of life was cast into the lake of fire."

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
### Romans 3

"26 for the demonstration, I say, of His righteousness at the present time, so that He would be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus."

"28 For we maintain that a man is justified by faith apart from works of the Law."

#### Romans 4:5

"But to the one who does not work, but believes in Him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is credited as righteousness,"





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# Will God's judgment be fair?

- · God will judge each of us fairly on the basis of righteousness.
- God's standard is simply to be true to ourselves as "image bearers" of God.
- For those who fear that they may fall short of God's image, He has provided a surrogate (substitute) who bears His image.
- · God's provision is a gift to all who will accept it in faith.
- We are invited to accept that gift and stand before a holy God clothed with the righteousness of Christ.
- We are also free to stand before God on the basis of our own righteousness. We do not have to accept Christ.
- We are not free to set the terms of the judgment nor are we to claim that God will not be just in His judgment.

1 Corinthians 1:30

"But by His doing you are in Christ Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification, and redemption."

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
