How can we avoid the "pit of disillusionment" in our faith?



John 12

"12 On the next day the great multitude who had come to the feast, when they heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem, 13 took the branches of the palm trees, and went out to meet Him, and began to cry out, "Hosanna! 'Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord,' even the King of Israel." 14 And Jesus, finding a young donkey, sat on it; as it is written, 15 'Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your King is coming, seated on a donkey's colt."

- "Hosanna" meaning "save now" was coupled with palm branches (victory & joy) (Lev.23:39-44).
- The Romans no doubt saw this as a rallying call for social revolution under a new "king of Israel".


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

Some common facts that have led to grand illusions.

False expectations can sometimes find "Scripture for support".

Mark 10:28-31

"Then Peter began to say to Him, "See, we have left all and followed You." So Jesus answered and said, "Assuredly, I say to you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or father or mother or wife or children or lands, for My sake and the gospel's, who shall not receive a hundredfold now in this time – houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and lands, with persecutions – and in the age to come, eternal life. But many who are first will be last, and the last first.""

We know that Jesus asks us to give up the empty hopes of this world (fame, fortune, physical comfort, etc.) with the expectation that they will come back to us because God loves us and wants us to prosper and be happy. 14

"who shall not receive a hundredfold now in this time – houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and lands, with persecutions"

How did the Apostles' lives exemplify this?




An illusion can be corrected through a renewed mind.

2. Ignore the context of the original readers of the text - grammatical, historical, theological, cultural, etc.

All Scripture is written for us but not about us or to us.

Some common mistakes in reading the Bible

4. Read the Bible through narrow cultural lenses - Understanding Biblical authority in ways that do not allow for the human authorship, customs, and literary practices of the time.

Mark 1:2

"As it is written in Isaiah the prophet, "Behold, I send My messenger before Your face, Who will prepare Your way;" (Mal.3:1)


"16 These things His disciples did not understand at the first; but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things were written of Him, and that they had done these things to Him. 17 And so the multitude who were with Him when He called Lazarus out of the tomb, and raised him from the dead, were bearing Him witness. 18 For this cause also the multitude went and met Him, because they heard that He had performed this sign"

The disciples were at first confused by the "mixed message" of a king without political power.


