Matthew 13:44-46

"The Kingdom of heaven is like a treasure hidden in the field, which a man found and hid; and from joy over it he goes and sells all that he has, and buys that field. Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant seeking fine pearls, and upon finding one pearl of great value, he went and sold all that he had, and bought it."

Two parables with similarity

- ✓ Something of value is found.
- ✓ The find brings joy.
- ✓ Great sacrifice is made to acquire what was found.

There are some things worthy of great sacrifice.

John 3:16

"For God so loved the world, that He give His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life."

Luke 14:33
