

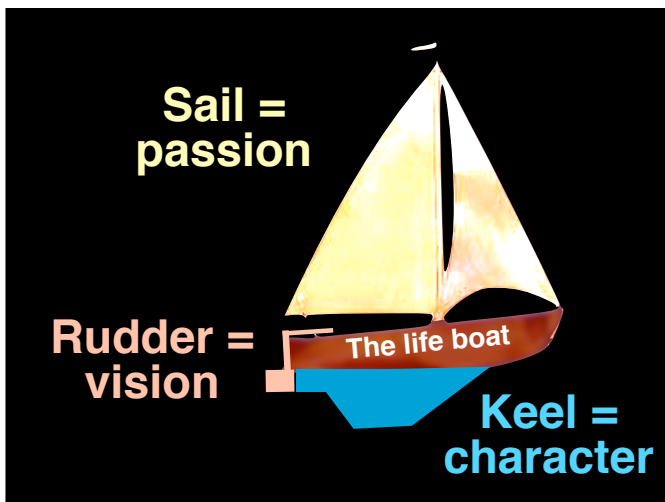

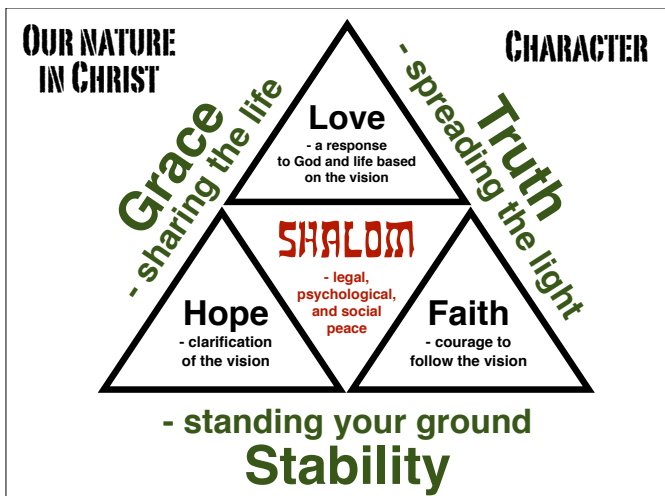

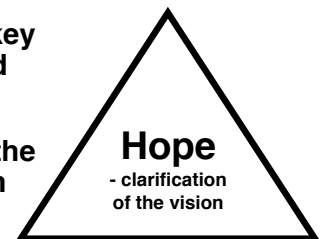

is a sight issue,
a heart issue, &
a prayer issue.*

What is the Hope of His calling?

Ephesians 1

“18 . . . what are the riches of the glory
of His **inheritance** in the saints, 19
and what is the surpassing greatness
of His **power** toward us who believe.”

“inheritance” “power”

heaven	earth
security	significance
we are “in Christ”	Christ is “in us”

“Anthony De Mello, a Jesuit priest from India tells
us the story of a monk who in his travels once found
a precious stone and kept it. One day he met a
traveler, and when the monk opened his bag to share
his provisions with him, the traveler saw the jewel
and asked the monk to give it to him. The monk did
so readily. The traveler departed overjoyed with the
unexpected gift of the precious stone that was
enough to give him wealth and security for the rest of
his life. However, a few days later he came back in
search of the monk, found him, gave him back the
stone, and entreated him, ‘Now give me something
much more precious than this stone, valuable as it is.
Give me that which enabled you to give it to me.’”

✓ We don't all start at the same place.



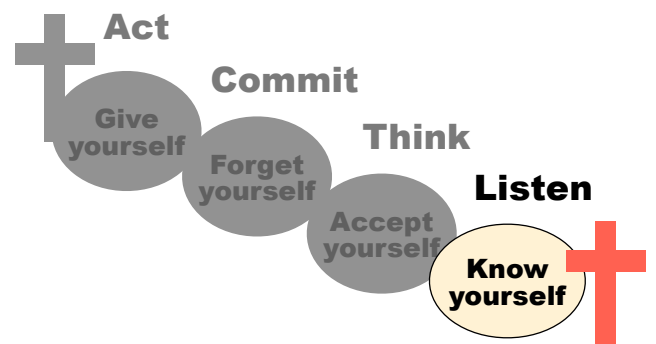
✓ To whom much is given, much is expected. *Matthew 13:12*
