

The evangelical church's four challenges with respect to sexual ethics

- Face the harsh realities of overt sexual abuse within Evangelical Christian churches.
- 93% of sex offenders describe themselves as religious.
- Statistically, a church of 200 members will have at least 41 child sexual abuse survivors.
- Those who sexually victimize children likely have victimized dozens over their lifetime.
- Most children never report sexual abuse, and when they do, it is often ignored.

 - When sex is talked about, the subject is too often rule driven with an emphasis on "Thou shalt NOT!".

The sexual revolution is over and the wrong side won.






Genesis 1:27 (Spirituality)

"God created man **in His own image**, in the image of God He created him; **male and female** He created them."

Matthew 19 (Security)

"4 And He answered and said, "Have you not read, that He who created them **from the beginning** made them male and female, 5 and said, 'For this cause a man shall leave his father and mother, and shall cleave to his wife; and the two shall become one flesh'? 6 Consequently they are no longer two, but one flesh. What therefore God has joined together, **let no man separate**.""






This is why the marriage covenant is so important.

Paul's Gospel message – salvation through faith. Romans 1

"16 For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek."

Mankind is without excuse and under God's wrath.

"18 For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who suppress the truth in unrighteousness,"

God let man's spiritual rebellion be reflected in unnatural lusts which dishonored the body.

²⁴ Therefore God gave them over in the lusts of their hearts to **impurity**, that **their bodies might be dishonored among them**. ²⁵ For they exchanged the truth of God for a lie, and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever. Amen.

Homosexual conduct, illustrates the unnaturalness of human spiritual rebellion.

"₂₆ For this reason God gave them over to degrading passions; for their women exchanged the natural function for that which is unnatural, ²⁷ and in the same way also the men abandoned the natural function of the woman and burned in their desire toward one another, men with men committing indecent acts and receiving in their own persons the due penalty of their error. ²⁸ And just as they did not see fit to acknowledge God any longer, God gave them over to a depraved mind, to do those things which are not proper, ²⁹ being filled with all unrighteousness, wickedness, greed, evil; full of envy, murder, strife, deceit, malice; they are gossips, ³⁰ slanderers, haters of God, insolent, arrogant, boastful, inventors of evil, disobedient to parents, ³¹ without understanding, untrustworthy, unloving, unmerciful;"

Paul is describing the cursed state of the human race not just the spiritual condition of homosexual individuals.

"9 What then? Are we better than they? Not at all; for we have already charged that both Jews and Greeks are all under sin; 10 as it is written, "There is none righteous, not even one; 11 There is none who understands, There is none who seeks for God; 12 All have turned aside, together they have become useless; There is none who does good, There is not even one.""

"23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."

Galatians 3:22

"But the Scripture has shut up everyone under sin, so that the promise by faith in Jesus Christ might be given to those who believe.

This is why sexual morality is a big issue in Christian theology.

- Our sexuality is near the core of our human identity and therefore a special arena for displaying the condition of our soul.
- We all stand in need of God's grace in the sexual area of life and therefore should bring a good bit of humility to our relationships and thankfulness for God's mercy.

1 Corinthians 6

"9 Or do you not know that the unrighteous shall not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived; neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor homosexuals, 10 nor thieves, nor the covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor swindlers, shall inherit the kingdom of God."

- This seems to suggest that no one with unmanaged sin issues will have a share in the kingdom of God.
 - But this presents a contradiction to Paul's teaching throughout his letters - even in this letter (1:1-9, 15:1-11,50-57).
 - ✓ Is it possible that Paul is stating a fact about those outside of faith in Christ's righteousness (the Corinthians before they came to faith)?

1 Corinthians 6


"11 Such were some of you; but you were washed, but you were **justified** in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and in the Spirit of our God. 12 All things are lawful for me, but not all things are profitable. All things are lawful for me, but I will not be mastered by anything. 13 Food is for the stomach, and the stomach is for food; but God will do away with both of them. Yet the body is not for immorality, but for the Lord; and the Lord is for the body."

- ✓ Paul refers to who the Corinthians "were" before they were justified by faith.
- The motivation for holiness was grace and a new identity not fear of moral disqualification.
- ✓ The Law could **no longer condemn** them but this did not mean that this was the only reason to resist yielding to sin.

1 Corinthians 6

"¹⁴ Now God has not only raised the Lord, but will also raise us up through His power. ¹⁵ Do you not know that your bodies are **members of Christ**? Shall I then take away the members of Christ and make them members of a harlot? May it never be! ¹⁶ Or do you not know that the one who joins himself to a harlot is one body with her? For He says, *"The two will become one flesh."* ¹⁷ But the one who joins himself to the Lord is **one spirit with Him**."

- \checkmark Our bodies will be raised as Christ was raised because we are one with him.
- ✓ It is our identity "in Christ" that is the rational for sexual ethics. We are to present our bodies as living sacrifices (Rom.12:1-2), which means that we be true to our "new self" (Eph.4:20-24).




1 Corinthians 6

"18 **Flee** immorality. Every other sin that a man commits is outside the body, but the immoral man **sins against his own body**. ¹⁹ Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and that **you are not your own**? ²⁰ For you have been **bought with a price**: therefore glorify God in your body."

Paul's guide to sexual morality

- ✓ Run: Take steps to separate yourself form temptation to let fleshly passions control your life.
- Remember: Remind yourself that your body is a holy place that should not be defiled.
- ✓ Replace: Paul is not saying 1) flee from sexuality, 2) flee from an immoral society (5:9-10) but rather 3) feed or sow to the Spirit not to your fleshly appetites (Gal.5:16-26, 6:8).



This is why sexual sins are uniquely shameful and destructive.

- Sexual sins are unique in that they are linked to the very core of our body and soul leaving deep shame, long lasting scars, that other transgressions do not.
- Our bodies were purchased by God, and united with Christ by faith, giving us a new position that is the motivation for our sexual behavior.
