

# Chastity

#### 1 Peter 3

"1 In the same way, you wives, be submissive to your own husbands so that even if any of them are disobedient to the word, they may be won without a word by the behavior of their wives, 2 as they observe your chaste and respectful behavior. 3 And let not your adornment be merely external braiding the hair, and wearing gold jewelry, or putting on dresses; 4 but let it be the hidden person of the heart, with the imperishable quality of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is precious in the sight of God. 5 For in this way in former times the holy women also, who hoped in God, used to adorn themselves, being submissive to their own husbands. 6 Thus Sarah obeyed Abraham, calling him lord, and you have become her children if you do what is right without being frightened by any fear. 7 You husbands likewise, live with your wives in an understanding way, as with a weaker vessel, since she is a woman; and grant her honor as a fellow heir of the grace of life, so that your prayers may not be hindered."

#### 1 Peter 2:21-3:12

"21 For you have been **called for this purpose**, since Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example for you to follow in His steps, 22 who committed no sin, nor was any deceit found in His mouth; 23 and while being **reviled**, He did not revile in return; while **suffering**, He uttered no threats, but kept entrusting Himself to Him who judges righteously; 24 and He Himself **bore our sins** in His body on the cross, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness; for by His **wounds** you were healed. 25 For you were continually straying like sheep, but now you have returned to the Shepherd and Guardian of your souls. 1 In the same way, you wives, . . . 7 You husbands likewise"














Perhaps the greatest distinctive of Biblical sexual ethics is the limited role that sex plays in the nourishing of our soul.

#### Genesis 2

"18 Then the Lord God said, "It is not good for the man to be **alone**; I will make him a helper suitable for him. . . ."








There are moral boundaries that exist for our benefit.	Anything is permitted so long as it is legal, safe, and mutual chosen.	

#### 1 Corinthians 5

"9 I wrote you in my letter not to associate with immoral people; 10 I did not at all mean with the immoral people of this world, or with the covetous and swindlers, or with idolaters; for then you would have to go out of the world. 11 But actually, I wrote to you not to associate with any so-called brother if he should be an immoral person, or covetous, or an idolater, or a reviler, or a drunkard, or a swindler – not even to eat with such a one. 12 For what have I to do with judging outsiders? Do you not judge those who are within the church? 13 But those who are outside, God judges. *Remove the wicked man from among yourselves.*"

#### Paul's recognizes limits and uses tough love.

- ✓ Different standards: Moral standards for confessing Christians are higher than for non believers.
- ✓ Judgment: Not every sinner in Corinth was disciplined through social separation — only those who gloried in their vice.
- ✓ Note: 2 Cor.2:1-11 indicates that penitent believers were to be welcomed and shielded from shame.
