


What is the meaning of it all?

Our response to the holiness of God resulting in God's judgment and His loving provision for us is key to understanding many of the mysteries of our common experience.






The fallen Cosmos bears witness to God's holy wrath.


- √ Nature operates imperfectly.

- √ The image of God and the values of His kingdom are displayed against the background of a fallen world.








Possonance - moral conflict Romans 7:19 "For the good that I wish, I do not do; but I practice the very evil that I do not wish."












Romans 8

"1 There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. 2 For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death. 3 For what the Law could not do, weak as it was through the flesh, God did: sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and as an offering for sin, He condemned sin in the flesh,"

In a culture that ignores the holiness of God there can be no deep insight into the most profound mysteries of nature.

- 1. If there is no holiness, there is no true beauty.
- 2. If there is no holy judgment, there is no deep explanation for many physical phenomena:
 - · physical death,
 - · social injustice,
 - · pain and suffering,
 - · corruption of nature.
- 3. If there is no holiness, there is no deep explanation for human imagination, longings, hopes, and fears.
- 4. If there is no holiness there is no basis for the universal impulse to worship.

"The theology of liberal protestantism was a God without wrath who brought men without sin into a kingdom without judgment through the ministrations of a Christ without a cross."

In a culture that ignores the holiness of God there is no rational basis of right and wrong.

- 1. If the Cosmos is all there is, was, or will be, then God's holiness is meaningless.
- 2. If holiness is meaningless, then ethics, morality, justice, and virtue are baseless, and arbitrary.
- 3. If morality is arbitrary, then there can be no basis for a common sense of good and evil.
- 4. But we all have a sense of good and evil.
- 5. We have reason to believe that we bear the image of a holy God.
