

John 17

"15 I do not ask You to take them out of the world, but to keep them from the evil *one*.
16 They are not of the world, even as I am not of the world. 17 Sanctify them in the truth; Your word is truth. 18 As You sent Me into the world, I also have sent them into the world. 19 For their sakes I sanctify Myself, that they themselves also may be sanctified in truth. 20 "I do not ask on behalf of these alone, but for those also who believe in Me through their word;"



If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. 16 For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh and the lust of the eyes and the boastful pride of life, is not from the Father, but is from the world. 17 And the world is passing away, and also its lusts; but the one who does the will of God abides forever."


Lust of the flesh - sensual gratification (sexual)

Lust of the eye - material obsession (social)

Pride of life - spiritual sovereignty (spiritual)

Not law centered but Christ centered.


Practiced holiness is

and normally displayed in and through the believer Holiness is a free rational response of worship.




Not denial of true self but being true to authentic self.
